Enrollment

Enrollment figures continue to climb at Siena Heights College, with the fall 1986 count above projections and higher than last year's totals.

The early fall enrollment headcount at Siena's main campus stood at 1,200 students, reflecting a 7.6 percent increase over last fall's enrollment. The breakdown of those enrolled this fall includes 774 full-time undergraduate students, 293 part-time undergraduates and 111 graduate students for a total of 12,696 credit hours.

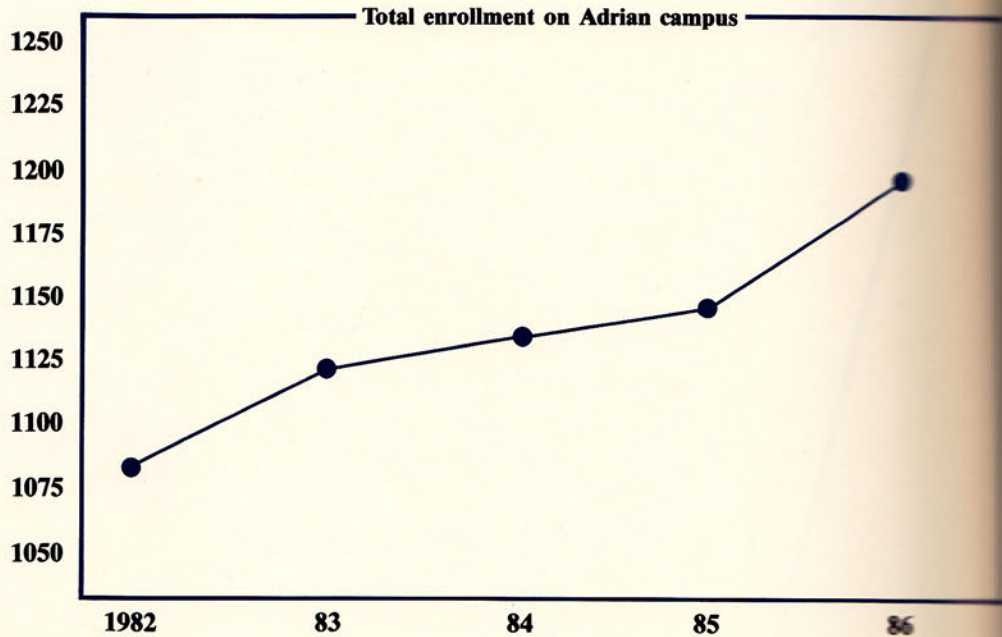
About 500 students are enrolled at Siena's degree completion centers, 450 at Southfield and 50 at Lake Michigan College in Benton Harbor.

Increased enrollment reflects diligent effort on the part of admissions counselors and faculty advisors as well. Retention of returning students is

also up over previous years as a result of careful attention paid to scheduling and student needs.

With firm admissions stan-

dards and career counseling procedures in place, Siena officials are confident that the current enrollment trend will continue.



Programs

With 34 programs of study, Siena Heights continues to appeal to a wide cross-section of students. Programs in business, English, philosophy, natural science, music and speech communications, office administration and human services attract many students seeking a liberal arts education with specializations in these areas. With a new graphic arts concentration in the curriculum, Siena's popular fine arts pro-

gram is attracting even more students.

An academic committee worked throughout last year to design a new college core curriculum that increases the number of core hours from 18 to 33. The new core requirement agreed on by the faculty will be effective in 1988. Strengthening the college core requirements puts Siena in a solid position to offer a strong traditional liberal arts education with a career oriented flavor.

Aside from the new college core requirements, there is a new adult services director to help advise and admit adult students on the main campus.

Siena's graduate programs in teacher education and agency counseling are still drawing many students. With adjunct faculty making up a large portion of the instruction in these areas, students get a unique opportunity to learn from instructors who have careers in teaching and counseling.

Financial Report

Continuing its tradition of operating in the black for 67 consecutive years, Siena finished the 1985-86 year on solid ground, due in great part to generous gifts from friends of the college. Siena's history of solvency is based on its ability to live within a budget - a fact which contributes to the institution's readiness to meet the challenges of higher education for many years to come.

In round figures, the college finished the year generating \$6.9 million in income, the bulk of the revenues from tuition and fees.

The college had gifts and grants totaling \$789,016 last fiscal year with \$649,017 of these gifts unrestricted. The total is up from \$663,112 gift income from 1984-85.

This year's goal will be to raise more than \$800,000 through gifts and grants to apply to the college's unrestricted operating budget which stands at just under \$7 million.

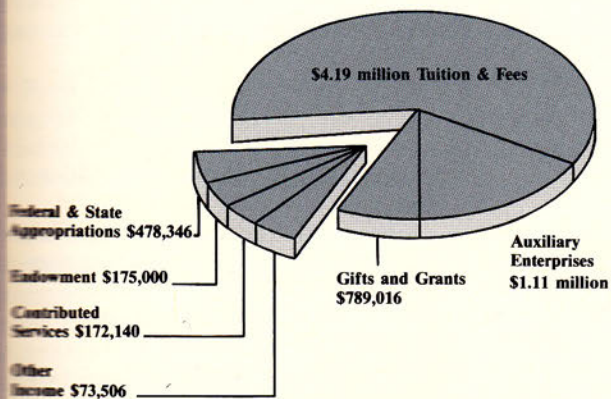
Allocations of Gifts

1985-86

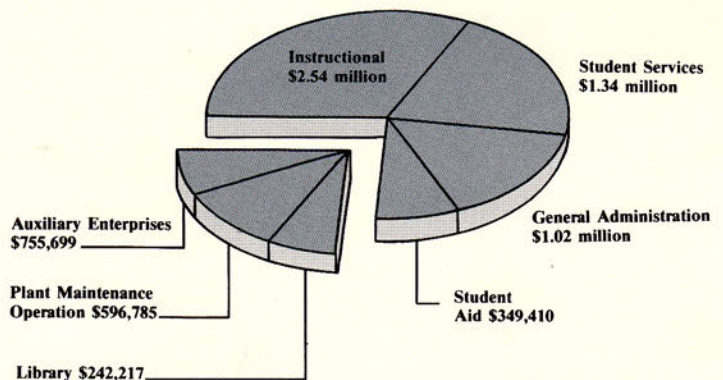

Expenditures



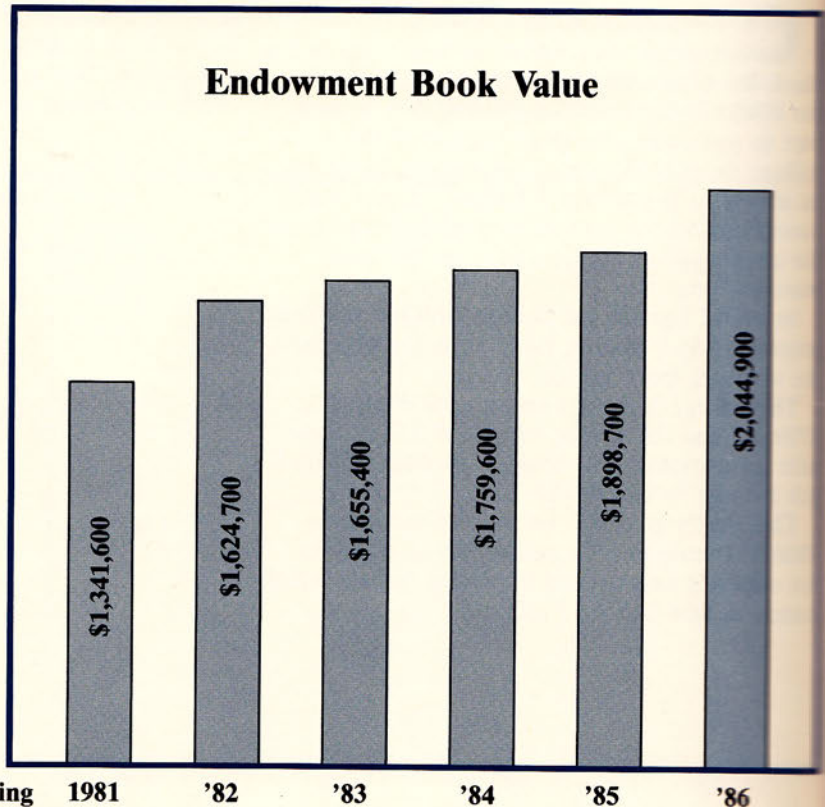
Endowment

Endowment. It is a term we've all heard. Most of us, however, are not quite certain exactly what it means to Siena Heights College.

Endowment is really quite a simple concept: Siena Heights, like virtually every college and university, maintains a fund that is designed never to be spent, but rather to be invested and the earnings used to the advantage of the college.

The existence of endowment at Siena Heights is an important part of the sound fiscal structure that keeps Siena Heights College solvent. Moreover, the outstanding management of the funds has resulted in our attractive tuition rates and our ability to attract and retain quality faculty and staff.

Because endowment is one of the building blocks that provides a strong foundation for the future, increasing the endowment fund will be a major thrust of the Siena community in the coming year. Attractive tax legislation and exciting new insurance vehicles are likely to add to the number of Siena Heights alumni and friends who will be able to establish endowment funds in the near future.



Planning

Given the sound financial status of the college and new encouraging enrollment figures, a word about the College's goals is now in order.

Siena Heights College is noted for its commitment to educational development of the total individual and its caring faculty, staff and administrators, and that commitment and attitude will carry through in its planning.

With a continued effort in the planning process, careful attention will be paid to continual development of academic excellence.

Siena will continue to inform others about the college through an ongoing public relations campaign that involves the immediate Siena community, its alumni, friends and board members.

The college will also put several of its programs in the spotlight -

academia is alive and well at Siena Heights.

Student life programs will continue to answer students' needs for leadership training and will address the issues of campus health and life.

With the continued effort of Siena's administration, faculty, staff, students and friends, the college will keep its current spot in the forefront as an affordable, caring, personalized institution.

Year in Review

- Chrysler Motors President Harold K. Sperlich was featured speaker at Siena Heights College Commencement '86. He told those attending, "You won't be able to do your very best unless you're determined to win." The college awarded nine master's, 262 bachelor's and 48 associate's degrees to December, May, and August graduates.
- The Adrian Dominican Congregation gave gifts last year totaling \$150,000 to the college. That figure was a portion of the total \$745,094 raised through gifts and grants.
- Two Siena Heights College Board of Trustee members retired from the board last year. Richard L. Berlin of Hudson and Burton R. Leathley of Adrian, were honored at an appreciation dinner in December. Berlin joined the board in 1976 and Leathley joined the board in 1979.
- Burton Leathley was further honored by the board by being named a Trustee Emeriti. He served the board as a member of the Academic Affairs, Athletic and College Relations Committee at various times during his tenure.
- Assistant Biology Professor Carl Kaster was voted by the Siena community as Outstanding Teacher for the 1985-86 school year. Plymouth resident Maura Cady and Detroit native Patrick Irwin were voted Outstanding Students. Cady graduated with a bachelor's degree in communications and Irwin with a bachelor's degree in business administration.
- Siena Heights College alumni topped the Phonathon '86 \$36,000 goal this year, raising \$8,000 more than last year's campaign. More than 100 faculty, staff, administration, students and alumni volunteered to call alumni, parents and students.
- Four Siena Heights students participated in a campus ministry project helping people in inner Detroit. The students and campus ministry director helped in soup kitchens and other inner-city agencies.
- Siena Heights College was one of five schools designated by the state to receive funds to form a partnership with a public school to institute a teen tutoring program. Siena Heights College students counseled Adrian Middle School drop-out prone Hispanics, helping them with studies and school-related problems. Siena Heights also administered a peer-tutoring program in cooperation with Adrian High School. Both programs were administered through Siena's Upward Bound program and with help from a local foundation.

- Board member Willard Reagan of Birmingham received this year's President's Cabinet Award at the Eighth Annual President's Cabinet Dinner held at Toledo's Inverness Country Club. Reagan, a partner in the Troy law firm of Stark and Reagan, received the award because of his commitment to Siena Heights and society as a whole. Reagan has been a member of the board of trustees for 20 years and served as chairman and member of the trustee selection committee. He is currently chair of the executive and legal committees for the college. Reagan received an honorary degree from the college in 1975.
- Six people joined the board this year including Doug Kapnick of Adrian, Patrick McDonald of Brighton, John Savage of Toledo, Andrew Creamer of Clarkston, Nicholas Thomas of Okemos and Arthur Erbskorn of Fayette. Erbskorn serves a one-year term by virtue of his National Alumni Association presidency.
- Several receptions for alumni were held last year - in Adrian, Toledo and Lansing. The receptions will continue this year kicked off with two in Florida.
- Siena President Sister Cathleen Real spoke to various organizations this year including the Birmingham Senior Men's Club, Lenawee County Zonta Club, and at Lake Michigan College where she delivered the commencement address.
- Ninety six percent of the 1985 Siena Heights College main campus graduates in bachelor degree programs are either working or continuing with higher education, according to Siena's Placement Office. One hundred nine of 110 1986 bachelor of arts graduates responded to the office's survey.

Logo change recaptures heritage



A move to recapture the Dominican tradition is in the works at Siena Heights as evident in the college's new stationery, publications and in goal setting.

To solidify the image of the college, the Catholic Dominican heritage will be stressed in mission statements and planning documents. The original Siena Heights College shield will be used on all publications and stationery of the college.

The shield was designed by Adrian Dominican Sister Helene O'Connor in 1939. It stems from the Escutcheon of the Adrian Dominican Congregation which was also designed by Sr. Helene.

The "Fleu-de-lis" in the college shield symbolizes lilies - representing the first congregation's roots in Prouille, France. (Prouille means "Fields of lilies").

The college shield includes a wavy line across the left side which symbolizes the heights or highs and lows. The open book on the left symbolizes the quest for knowledge.

The official seal has replaced the geometric figure used since the mid-seventies on all publications.

Adult students have new service director

A new adult services program at Siena Heights College has been very well-received according to program director Bill McDermott.

The adult services program is geared specifically toward adults who attend Siena either as full- or part-time students. Its goals are to not only help with the admissions and advising processes, but also to alert students to specific services available at the college.

"Figures show that adults could change careers up to five times during their working life," McDermott pointed out. "This is where colleges are beginning to market, and I think Siena is ahead of the game."

McDermott came to Siena's main campus after four years at the Southfield Center, Siena's degree completion center near Detroit. There, the entire focus is on adults finishing degrees or taking coursework to initiate career changes or advancement.

He hopes to see Siena's main cam-

pus program bolstered so that adult students will have a wider variety of courses offered at times which fit their family and work schedules.

"We really need to add more weekend courses to meet the needs of the adult students who are involved with jobs," he said.

As the trend to educate the non-traditional student in a college setting continues, more and more colleges and universities are vying for their business.

"Service is the focal point. Whichever college best provides adults with services they need to have a successful college experience, will be the college to draw the adult student populations," McDermott said.

Siena has shown a commitment to adult students throughout the years, drawing a significant amount of students from the adult community for the past 10 years. The admissions administration this summer sent out a questionnaire to survey students' needs for summer school and tailored the summer schedule to those needs.

"This is the type of approach I hope we continue to employ," he said.

Siena is also working with local businesses to pair employees with the college's resources to help in careers or personal enrichment.

Other services available to adult students at Siena include personal and career counseling and support from peers. There is a gathering spot in the student union as well as an organization called the Program for Adult and Commuter Students.

Siena names three to administration

Two new to Siena Heights and one familiar administrator have been appointed to administrative positions at the college.

John B. Bennett has been named dean of the college and provost. He comes to Siena with seven years of experience on the American Council on Education (ACE) in Washington, D.C., an umbrella organization which concerns itself with issues of higher education.

Dr. Bennett most recently held the position of Director of Department Leadership Programs with ACE. In this position Bennett identified current issues and program needs on a national basis in relation to ACE. He also developed links between academic and ACE administrators.

Dr. Bennett has a master's and doctorate from Yale University in philosophical theology.

He and his wife Elizabeth Dreyer, who teaches at the Theological Union in Washington, D.C., will make their home in Adrian. Bennett has two teenage children.

Dr. Bennett replaces acting dean Sharon Weber, O.P., who was elected to the general council of the Adrian Dominicans. Sr. Sharon was in that position filling in for Jim Ebben who was on sabbatical last year.

In other appointments, James A. Ebben has been named vice president for planning and resource allocation. He began in this capacity in July after one year sabbatical and after five years as Dean and Provost at Siena. Ebben also served as interim president of the college in 1983-84.

In his new capacity at Siena, Ebben will work closely with the president to develop long-range plans for the college. He will work to coordinate planning activities with the president and work with the administration to develop planning strategies.

Ebben will also coordinate development and implementation of a faculty staff evaluation system.

Ebben joined Siena's staff as Director of Professional Development in 1976. He has a master's degree in both scholastic philosophy from Marquette University and in analytical philosophy from Duke University. He has a doctorate from Michigan State in educational administration.

During last year's sabbatical, Ebben researched the role of administrative council in the decision-making process at a church-related school.

He and his wife Marilyn, who is a member of Siena's faculty, live in Adrian and are the parents of three children.

Sam J. Kennedy was named vice president for development in June.

Kennedy comes to Siena after nine years of development work at Shrine High School in Royal Oak. He served as director of development there since 1977.

At Shrine, he was also responsible for all forms of annual, planned and capital giving as well as setting goals for capital campaigns and special giving. He is certified by the National Society of Fund Raising Executives.

Kennedy has done post-graduate work in the non-profit organization administration program at the

University of Notre Dame, holds a master's degree in education, guidance and counseling from Oakland University where he also holds a bachelor's degree in biological science.

He is a member of the National Catholic Development Conference, the National Society of Fund Raising Executives and the Michigan Association of School Development, an organization which he founded.

He will oversee all aspects of fundraising at Siena Heights including both annual and planned giving, alumni relations and public relations.

He is married and he and his wife Mary Ellen are the parents of three children.

Addiction relapse addresses a current epidemic

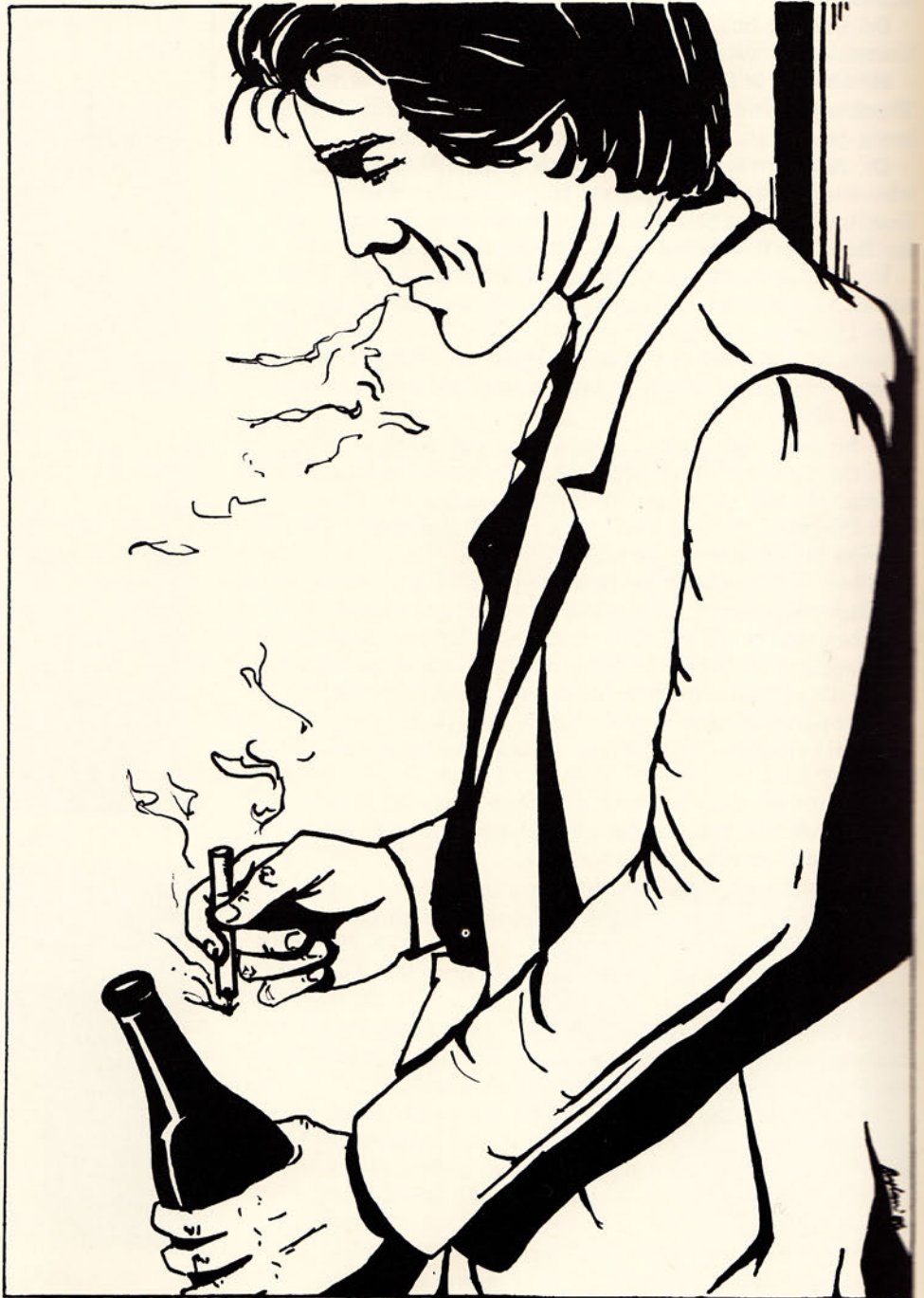

It was the third Thursday night in as many weeks that 12-year-old Heather had her father for a partner in the mother-daughter exercise class at the local YMCA. Where was her mom? Why was she the only kid in the class with a dad for a partner - it was a little embarrassing.

For the third Thursday in as many weeks, Heather's dad Harold tried to smile as he went through the motions during an exercise class that his wife should have been at. Why couldn't she remember the class that was so important to their daughter? He didn't think he could stand another week of this embarrassment.

Karla wheeled her car into the driveway. She'd had another successful day as a salesperson for a prominent art supply company. She'd had a wonderful evening winding down with coworkers at a local bar, but now she worried that her husband would give her that cold stare when she came into the kitchen. As she got out of her car in the garage attached to their stylish home in a well-to-do suburb, a shot of panic struck her - it was Thursday, she missed that damn exercise class again. She would have to remember next week.....

Jack sat in the courtroom wringing his hands. He was about to go before the toughest judge in the county on this third drunk driving charge. He had violated probation. He was sure to go to jail. His wife and two children had left him this time - he didn't blame them. He'd been a terrible father. What was he going to do now? He had nothing to live for.



These two scenarios are totally fictitious, yet ring true to dozens of addiction counselors throughout the nation, who struggle daily to come to terms with addictions and relapse.

A Sage Conference was held on Siena's campus in June to help counseling professionals with the issue of addiction relapse. About 60 professionals from throughout the nation and Canada attended the conference which was organized by Siena's Graduate Studies Director Dr. Miriam Stimson, O.P.

"We chose a very important topic this year, one that many counselors are struggling with," Dr. Stimson said.

Dr. Stimson gathered several speakers from throughout the country who addressed relapse topics including "Spirituality and Relapse," "Lifestyle Modifications in Relapse Prevention," "The Effects of Consuming De-Alcoholized Beverages," and Determinants of Relapse: Implications for Behavior Change."

Several experts made up the speakers circuit at the three-day conference including Charles L. Whitfield, M.D., the medical director of the Resource Group and a clinical professor of medicine at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, and G. Alan Marlatt, Ph.D., the director of the Addictive Behaviors Research Center and psychology professor at the University of Washington in Seattle.

"Relapse is a topic of great concern today. We invited people with diverse views to appeal to many different counselors," Dr. Stimson noted.

Dr. Stimson also lectured, her topic: "Nutrition and Its Role in Relapse."

"We had speakers with a real basic approach to addiction relapse and we

had those with some very new and interesting ideas on approaching relapse."

Dr. Stimson took on the graduate program in 1978 and in 1981, Siena began the current agency counseling program and, with the help of a grant from the Sage Foundation began a master's program in addic-

tion counseling in 1983. The faculty in the graduate program are all practicing counselors who bring practical experience to their classrooms.

"We're always looking at different ideas in relation to counseling, and that is why our program stands above others," Dr. Stimson said.

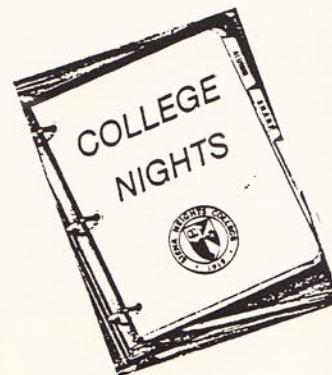
A variety of people have chosen to get involved in the program, Schwartz says, some of whom have strong roots with

Summer enrollment:

Best numbers ever

After responding to the needs of its students, summer enrollment at Siena Heights College took a dramatic swing upward, according to Associate Dean Robert Gordon.

Summer school hours jumped from 821 total semester hours in 1985 to 1,300 this past summer on the Adrian campus, while they rose from 1,463 in 1985 to 1,780 at the Southfield branch. Even the Lake Michigan campus had a dramatic increase, as hours jumped from 72 in 1985 to 162 this summer.

The Siena Heights administration surveyed the student body in early 1986 about its preference for summer school courses. Over 700 students responded, Gordon said, and the administration followed the students needs.

"We put a concerted effort into finding out what the market needs were and meeting those needs. Basically, we employed sound management and it proved quite profitable," Gordon said.

Sheila Dwyer Schwartz '84 has been named Director of Alumni Relations here. She replaces Acting Director Florence Rapin who left the college to take a job in Elkhart, Ind.

Sheila has been with Siena Heights College for the past three years in admissions, most recently as assistant admissions director.

Women's soccer debuts at Siena

Siena Heights College soccer coach Doug Mello is used to building something out of nothing.

It was just three short years ago that Mello left a successful program at Aquinas College to become the coach of Siena Heights' first men's varsity soccer team. After compiling a superb 11-7-1 record in that initial campaign, the Saints steadily improved over the last two seasons, including last year's 17-6-3 team that won the District 23 Championship, the Area 6 crown and advanced to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) national tournament.

Now Mello gets another chance to prove his building prowess, as he leads the Siena Heights women's soccer team into its first varsity season this fall. The 29-year-old Mello said coaching women is not that different from directing men.

"Tactically they're as smart as the men, and our skill level of the women here at Siena is very good," he said. "The one difference you find in women's soccer is that many of their goals come from finesse, while the men score more power-type goals."

Coaching women is nothing new to Mello, even though most of his collegiate experience has been as a men's coach. This past summer he toured Australia as

coach of a United States girls select team (an all-star group of high school players from around the country).

"My experience with the select team was very helpful to me. It gave me a chance to experiment with some of the things I plan on using with the Siena Heights team," Mello said.
