Foley Serves As Interim President; Real Resigns



Sister Nadine Foley, OP, '45, former Prioress of the Adrian Dominican Congregation, has assumed the position of Interim President.

Sister Cathleen Real announced her

resignation as President of the College at the October 30, 1993, Board Meeting. Effective January 1, 1994, Real became President Emerita and continues to work on fundraising efforts and association business for the College.

Real became President in 1984. During her tenure at Siena Heights, the College has expanded operations in Michigan to include programs at Monroe and Battle Creek, added degree offerings, and launched a successful major capital campaign which resulted in construction of a new instructional facility.

Foley earned her B.S. Degree from

Siena Heights College; M.S. in Biology, M.A. and Ph.D. in Philosophy -- all from Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.; and S.T.M. in Scripture from Union Theological Seminary in New York. She served on the General Council of the Congregation for ten years and in a presidential capacity for the Leadership Conference of Women Religious for three years. She has a wealth of teaching and administrative experience, previously serving on the faculty at Barry University, Drake University, Harvard University, Marist College where she chaired the Humanities Division, and Siena Heights College.

Julie Beutler '93 Follows Her Dream

Julie A. Beutler '93 received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree last May. In August she opened Angelwood Gallery in Grand Rapids, Ohio. "I always knew I wanted a gallery. I went back and forth between opening one and going to graduate school." Instead of filling

out college applications, she signed a lease and began turning the Front Street storefront into an attractive place to market both her own art and that of other artists.

Beutler is a potter who has never taken an accounting or management course. She credits her four years as the Klemm Gallery assistant at Siena Heights with her training. "A lot of the reason I am where I am is because of my experiences as Gallery Assistant." Working with instructors Chris Reising and Donna Milbauer '89 on designing, lighting, and hanging various shows has paid off. Angelwood Gallery displays sculpture, paintings, drawings, jewelry, pottery and other fine art items.

Campus Notes

Deborah Danielson, Associate Professor of Art, had her platinum/palladium print, "Dollhouse", chosen for the Toledo Friends of Photography National Juried Photographic Exhibition last November.

Jack Bologna, Associate Professor of Management, gave a boost to the criminal justice reference section in the College's library by donating 42 books in three categories: white collar crime, computer security, and intelligence. Bologna is an expert on the topics covered by the books he donated. He's had eight books published, mostly on white collar crime and fraud. Bologna also wrote an article, *Security and Legal Issues in MIS*, published in the January 1994 issue of the AMA Management Handbook (3rd edition).

Toni Carroll, Associate Professor of Mathematics, was nominated for the

Louise Hay Award for Excellence in Mathematics Education by the Association for Women in Mathematics.

Dom Scibilia, Assistant Professor of Religious Studies and Co-Director of the Spirituality and Peacemaking Institute, had a review of R. Scott Appleby's book *Church and Age Unite* published in the August 14, 1993, issue of *America*, a religious studies journal.

A Treasured Legacy: Sister Eileen Rice, OP

How do you go about describing Sister Eileen Rice, OP, to someone who did not know her? Most people who have a connection with Siena Heights College will recognize her. For nearly 20 years, Eileen was a member of the faculty at Siena Heights. In his introduction of Eileen at the 1993 Fall Convocation, Dean of the College and Provost Robert Gordon said, "It's not often that one is privileged to introduce a legend." Gordon's remark couldn't have been more true. Sister Eileen Rice is a legend.

Sister Eileen passed away on January 10th after a lengthy battle with breast cancer. Her determination and courage throughout her illness only heightened the respect and admiration of those who knew her. Eileen said, "I am not afraid of dying, the thing that matters most is the quality of my life until then." She believed, "People may die 'before their time' but we all have the amount of time we're supposed to have."

Making the most of her time, Eileen touched countless lives. Not only did she help train over 1,500 students for careers in education, but she also served on numerous committees and boards at local, state, and national levels. Eileen was a mentor for her peers as well as others.

"It is my conviction that we're all really teaching all of the time and we're all really learning all of the time," said Eileen in her address at Fall Convocation. She stressed this

to students in her education, senior core and Idea Tasting classes as well as to students of life. "We're all

teaching as many lessons as we're learning," she said.

Within the last 20 years Eileen gave over 500 presentations nationwide. She believed this was an example of being part of a small college. "People do have space to develop a lot of different aspects of themselves." She travelled all over the country presenting her thoughts on learning and education as well as philosophy, religion, mathematics, and more.

Perhaps the most surprising subject in Eileen's vast repertoire was art.

She began by talking about learning styles to docents at the Toledo Museum of Art. She went on to present other art related topics including "Adolescents and Art" to major art institutes across the country. One of her career highlights was speaking at the National Docent Symposium at the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C.

Eileen was famous for being in her office, advising students, at 6:30 a.m. She often returned phone calls after her evening classes. Eileen's energy level knew no bounds. She expected the very best from her students and earned the "affectionate" nickname "Attila the Nun". A student said, "I was terrified because of everything she expected...She was a woman who loved what she did and went to whatever extent she needed to help."

Each person who knew Eileen holds special thoughts and reflections on her radiant personality. For so many students, Eileen made dreams become reality. "She believed in me and taught me to believe in myself," said one former student. Sister Eileen's spirit will continue to be felt throughout the College. As Interim President Nadine Foley said, "She will remain with us in memory as a treasured legacy."

Remembrances at Vigil for Sister Eileen Rice, OP

January 13, 1994

Ladies and gentlemen, a legend has died. We gather this evening to remember the life of one of the foremost educators of our times. We gather to remember our colleague and friend, Sister Eileen Rice.

On Monday morning, the morning Eileen died, Adrian awoke to a winter-scape that symbolized Eileen's life and her legacy. The overnight temperature had fallen to seven below zero. Most of you know that Eileen hated cold weather. In fact, she started to get the chills when the temperature dropped below 85. Seven below zero, in Eileen's mind, was equivalent to the onset of another ice age. And, in fact, for a couple of hours on Monday morning we had a local ice age. The low temperature and the high humidity left every tree, every piece of vegetation in Adrian covered with thick hoarfrost. At first light all one could see were the dim outlines of frost-wrapped trees rising imperceptibly out of the snow-covered ground and merging into an overcast sky. It was cold and it looked colder still.

At daybreak the sun broke through and bathed the frost-covered trees in dazzling white light. The darkness was over. The new day was greeted with a whiteness beyond words. It was fitting that on this cold, somber morning the frost, the trees, and the life-giving force of the sun combined to create a brilliant white scene that paid homage to one of the truly remarkable people of our community. For in life we can dwell on the coldness, the dark, and the evil. Or we can choose the warmth, the light, and the good. To my way of thinking the beautiful imagery of Monday morning was Eileen's way of saying to us, "Choose light, choose truth, choose knowledge, choose good, choose hope, choose love, choose life."

There are many qualities for which Eileen will be remembered. Who could forget her boundless energy, her super-human capacity for hard work, her organization, her warmth, her enthusiasm, her goodness? Who could forget what she called her "tenuous relationship with gravity" as she tried to walk while balancing her teacup and her book bag? Who could forget her incredible capacity to make student-athletes feel important even though they understood fully that she knew nothing about the world of athletics? And, who could forget Eileen's remarkable intellect and her unending quest for knowledge. Eileen was one of the most widely read people I've ever known. She was quite literally in love with ideas. She read everything. Science, mathematics, philosophy, history, education, and more. Eileen further developed her intellect by attending concerts, scholarly lectures, cultural events, and by visiting museums of every imaginable description.

What did Eileen do with all the knowledge she acquired? What else? She taught. Wow, did she teach. She taught young students, older students, teachers, preachers, administrators, docents, businesspeople. If it moved, Eileen taught it. While Eileen was highly conversant with the great thinkers of the ages, it was not the grand abstractions that really mattered to her. What mattered was you. Just you as a unique individual, a person with dreams, ideals, gifts, problems, and limits. She did not have some abstract notion of where you should be or where you should be going. She simply met you where you were and began to teach you. It was precisely because Eileen took you as you were that she was such a great teacher. Eileen never forgot that the Latin root of the word educate means, "to draw out". Eileen had a profound capacity to draw out of you that which is best. Of course she gave you skills, knowledge, and understanding. But, what Eileen put into you was insignificant compared to what she drew out of you.

The intellectual origins of Eileen's teaching genius are not difficult to identify. She believed in the Christian faith, especially the principles that people are good and should be treated with dignity, love, and charity. She believed in the Dominican motto, "To contemplate and to give unto others the fruits of your contemplation." And, she believed in the fundamental democratic principle that people can improve themselves and their society through education. Nor do we have to look far for those personal influences that helped make Eileen a great teacher. She had the enormous good fortune to have been born into the Rice family of Owosso, Michigan. She was nourished beyond measure by the Adrian Dominican Sisters. She was supported and challenged by her colleagues at Siena Heights. She drew sustenance from her friends and professional associates in Lenawee County, in the state of Michigan, and around the nation. And, Eileen drew greatness from her students.

Eileen gave her life to her students. To her thousands of students. There's nothing complicated here. Just an incredible person giving her extraordinary talents to enrich the lives of her students. But you students should not think this was a one-way proposition. Each hour you helped Eileen understand herself, her profession, and her world more fully. Each day you helped Eileen do God's work by making her a more complete educator and a more complete human being. You students will never know how much you gave to Eileen.

Last September I was privileged to introduce Eileen as the speaker at Siena's fall convocation. On behalf of the Siena community I wanted Eileen to know our appreciation for her most precious gift to the college—her love of teaching. I closed my introduction by saying: "What does Eileen Rice mean to Siena Heights? Above all else she means teaching excellence. In fact, she defines teaching excellence at Siena. "Eileen, you are the teaching soul of this college. You honor us with your presence, your talents, your character, your wisdom, your courage, and your good cheer. There are no words, no tribute sufficient to express our gratitude for everything you do for Siena and for your profession. So, on behalf of the entire community I will simply say, 'Thank you', and assure you that each of us will strive to pass on to our brothers and our sisters your legacy of teaching excellence."

And now just three months later the time has come to pay another tribute to Eileen. To pay, in fact, our final tribute. Eileen's family and friends, the Adrian Dominican Sisters, and innumerable others have suffered a deep loss. At Siena, we have lost the quarterback of our faculty. There is much sadness on this occasion. However, there is also the inexpressible joy of being able to say, "I knew a truly great teacher. I knew Eileen Rice."

But, knowing Eileen has a price. "The good sister", as Eileen would refer to herself when she wanted something from you, would want you to contemplate deeply about your mission in life and then give the fruits of your contemplation to those around you. In true Eileen fashion she has given us a life-long assignment, an assignment that calls on us to transform our own lives and the lives of others. Eileen never let you off easy. So, as we fight back from the cold, the sadness, the emptiness caused by Eileen's death, let us remember her gifts of light, of joy, of truth, of teaching, of love, and of good. And, let us vow to give to others our own gifts for the rest of our lives. That's all Eileen would ask.

Commitment Renewed by the College to the Adult Non-Traditional Student

Siena Heights College continues to be on the cutting edge in providing quality education to the working adult who needs a flexible schedule and a choice of academic programs to earn a four-year degree. Changes have been made to adjust to the times and demands of the educational market. Dr. William McDermott, Dean of Off-Campus Programs and Assistant Professor of General Studies, explains: "We try to customize our curriculum to meet the needs of each community we serve."

There are currently four off-campus centers located throughout the state: the Southfield Center, serving metro Detroit, Monroe County Community College in Monroe, Kellogg Community College in Battle Creek, and Lake Michigan College in Benton Harbor. Because the College has chosen to be accessible to the busy adult, Siena Heights is exploring additional sites in lower Michigan.

All centers serve the non-traditional student -- whether a transfer student,

or someone with an associate's degree coming from the two-year college to earn their bachelor's degree. Currently, at each degree completion center, curriculum changes are being made and new majors will be offered. The College is also developing a new master's degree program under the leadership of Dr. Peggy Treece-Myles, Director of Graduate Studies. The program will begin this summer in Adrian and be extended to all Siena Heights College sites throughout 1995.

Since 1977 there have been over 2,200 graduates from the Southfield Center, 275 from Lake Michigan campus, which started in 1982, 55 from Monroe County Community College which opened in 1990, and 5 from the newest center at Kellogg Community College which was established in 1992. As the centers continue to meet the needs of their students, the results are satisfied graduates and increased enrollment.

Deb Carter, Program Director of the Lake Michigan campus, states, "We

are experiencing our highest enrollment since the fall of 1982 with a total of 126 students." Seventy percent enrolled at the Southfield Center are referred by current students or graduates. By May of 1994, Monroe will double its number of graduates to 100. Margie Bacarella, Program Director at Monroe explains, "With our increased growth we feel we are getting the Siena Heights message to the community." In fact, comments Zadie Jackson, Program Director for the Kellogg Center, "I have not found it necessary to recruit. Our classes are filled and we can't keep up with the demand."

Flexible scheduling, customized curriculum, accessible campus locations, and satisfied graduates have brought success to Siena Heights' non-traditional program. To ensure future success, the College will continue to meet the changing needs of today's busy adult student in a very competitive educational market.

Reflections from the Past

In 1926 I traveled from Birch Run to Flint by way of interurban. There we boarded the train and went to Adrian. A car met us at the depot and the driver let us out right in front of the College.

Having lived in the country these buildings were big and impressive. When we first entered the building we walked up the marble steps to the dorm. The dorm was on the second floor. At this time this was an all girls school. In the dorm there were four beds for the girls. Sister Francis Joseph shared the dorm with us. On the grounds was the college, an infirmary for the girls, and an infirmary for the nuns called Maria Hall. There was an academy and a small auditorium where they had plays and entertainment, music, etcetera.

At the college we were given finishing school training, education, room, and board. At the end of the year we were given a limited certificate which allowed us to teach in a rural school, grades K-8 for one year. We had to continue our education at Ypsilanti in order to get a life certificate. We received all of this for five hundred dollars a year.

We had one field trip. It was a trip to the Irish Hills to the orchard. Here we were served cider and doughnuts. I remember this quite vividly.

When the nuns came to the Holy Rosary Chapel (which was on the first floor) it was very impressive. They came here for mass every day. They seemed to march in. First came the postulants wearing black, then came the white veils, and behind the white veils came the senior nuns dressed in black. They all took their places in the chapel for mass. It seemed like hundreds of nuns.

I will always look upon this year as one of the most memorable and formative years of my life. I will always be grateful for the education and training I received at Siena Heights College sixty-seven years ago.

Thank you for the opportunity you have given me to reflect on the year 1926.

alumni will always be on view at Angelwood. Alumni featured in the opening exhibit included: Don Billmaier '92, Judy Kastel '92, Susan Mosko '93, Connie Stose '93, Ann Williams '93, and Mark Haines '94. Artists in the Toledo area are also part of the stable of artists for Angelwood Gallery.

Beutler has very strong feelings about her experiences at Siena Heights. "I would never change going to Siena Heights College. What I learned there about how to

be an artist made me the kind of person I am today." She speaks with fond thoughts of her experiences in Italy with a college-arranged summer of study abroad. "Siena Heights went out of its way for us to find the best possible experience. It was excellent." She recalled studying Michelangelo in the morning and visiting his works in the afternoon. "How can you not be influenced by Italy? Everywhere there is art."

Entering the BFA program as a painter, Beutler changed her mind about her concentration after one

ceramics course. What she describes as *magical clay* enticed her to lay aside her brushes and paints for clay tools and a potter's wheel. "I will never go away from clay." After working in her gallery all day, Beutler goes home every evening to throw vases, bottles, mugs and other pieces for sale in Angelwood Gallery. She mixes her own glazes and fires each piece herself. She says it takes persistence and patience and that she is still learning a lot. "I love art and I love ceramics, so it isn't really work."
