October 1994 was a month filled with excitement and activity on the Adrian Campus of Siena Heights College. In honor of the College's 75th Jubilee, Mayor

Margaret Noe's Quest For Justice

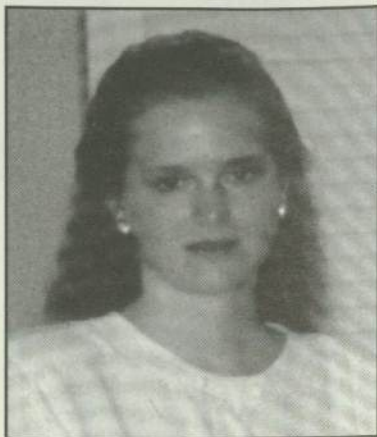

Mark DiPietro '83 Returns to Siena Heights College As Faculty Member



Siena Heights College alumnus Mark DiPietro has returned to the College as a member of the teaching faculty in the theatre division. "I am ecstatic to be teaching theatre to people who love it," exclaimed DiPietro. He brings a rich background of acting and teaching to his new position.

DiPietro graduated from Siena Heights in 1983 with a Bachelor's Degree in Theatre Speech Communications and a secondary teaching certificate. Following graduation, he worked in the communications field for both WABJ and WQTE radio stations in Adrian before returning to life as a student.

DiPietro earned his Master of Fine Arts Degree in Acting from Brandeis University in Waltham, Massachusetts in 1989. He completed his degree

requirements within two years and was invited back for a third year as an artist in residence. "It was great. I was being paid to be an actor."

Following his final year at Brandeis, DiPietro worked as a professional actor in New England. He did free-lance commercials as well as industrial training films. "Waiting for Godot" was one of many theatrical stage productions in which DiPietro appeared. He also paid his dues at what he calls his "waiting job". He worked as a soloist and church cantor for St. Jude Parish in Waltham. Children's theatre has also been a career accomplishment for DiPietro. He directed and toured with several productions including "A Christmas Carol" and "Shakespeare for Children". He has also worked with the Children's Theatre Program at Siena Heights.

DiPietro is currently preparing to direct "Twelfth Night, Or What You Will" for Theatre Siena in April of 1995. "I am very excited about directing Shakespeare at Siena Heights. I can't wait to get started," comments DiPietro. DiPietro is married to Camila Malhoit, a 1987 graduate of Siena Heights.

New Director of Residence Life Feels Right at Home

Judith Nemitz was hired as Director of Residence Life. She replaces former Director and Assistant Dean of Students, Tom Maxon, who resigned to pursue other career interests.

Nemitz is originally from Traverse City, Michigan. She received her M.A. in Student Personnel Services from Ball State University in Muncie, Indiana. Before accepting the position at Siena Heights, Nemitz was the Assistant Director for Residential Life at The Indiana Academy for Science, Mathematics and Humanities at Ball State University.

While employed by Ball State, Nemitz worked primarily with high school students who were housed on campus. She began looking for another job because she wanted to work with college-age students and because she wanted to return to her



home state. "I wanted to come back to Michigan and I wanted to be at a small, liberal arts school," Nemitz explained.

So far, Nemitz has been growing attached to the greater Adrian community as well. "People are very friendly. It has a quaint atmosphere," she commented. "I feel...at home at Siena and in Adrian.

Tsuji held positions in the Biology Departments of the University of Texas, University of Michigan, and Michigan State University. Tsuji is married and has two children, Haley and Tyler, who are 2 1/2 years and 1 year old.

The long awaited dedication of the new classroom and conference center took place on Friday, October 21st. Chairman of the Board of Trustees Andrew Creamer announced, "On behalf of the Siena Heights College Board of Trustees, I officially name this new

instructional facility Dominican Hall, dedicated to the spirit of the Adrian Dominican Sisters." The name was chosen in gratitude to the Adrian Dominicans who, "forged a path for us to follow." Creamer added, "The spirit of the Adrian Dominican Congregation is felt by all of us. The spirit of the Adrian Dominican Sisters is our heritage for the past and our vision for the future."

Dominican Prioress Patricia Walter commented, "When we look at this building we are reminded of the vision, the imagination and the risk-taking which women had 75 years ago." She expressed gratitude for the close connections between the College and the Dominicans.

Creamer continued, "Here at Siena Heights we wanted to do more than name a building, we wanted to weave Dominican values throughout the building, creating a vibrant testimony to the beliefs which we share as educators and citizens." In recognition of the generosity of special friends of the College, the Board of Trustees resolved that portions of Dominican Hall be dedicated to those who shared in the vision of the building (See sidebar on page 5).

The culmination of the **Vision 2000** campaign was celebrated with the unveiling of the Wall of Honor. Doug Kapnick, co-chairperson for the campaign, was assisted in the unveiling by the honorary chairs of the Wall of Honor Program Miriam Stimson, OP, a 1936 alumna, and Sheila Dwyer Schwartz, a 1984 alumna who launched the Wall of Honor program. The Wall of Honor plaque hangs in the first floor lobby of Dominican Hall and is inscribed with the names of supporters who gave a gift of \$1,000 or more to the **Vision 2000** campaign. It was also announced that the Herrick Foundation presented the College with a \$500,000 grant for scholarship in the name of Sr. Cathleen Real, Past President of Siena Heights.

Following the dedication of Dominican Hall, members of the President's Cabinet and donors to the Wall of Honor enjoyed the festivities of the President's Cabinet Dinner. President and Mrs. Artman welcomed guests as they entered Benincasa Dining Hall. Guests were served hors d'oeuvres prior to an elegant meal. Chairman of the Board Andrew Creamer made introductory comments and Dr. Artman welcomed guests. Members of the President's Cabinet give a gift of \$1,000 or more annually.

Alumni Weekend kicked off on Friday evening with the Welcome Back reception in Sage Union. Recent alums gathered for an informal reception at Mandy's Bar and Grill later in the evening. On Saturday, a special breakfast was held in honor of the Class of 1944, the fiftieth anniversary class. Events continued throughout the day with the Anniversary Luncheon honoring all anniversary classes. The Class of 1974, celebrating their twentieth anniversary, brought the most alums back for the weekend.

Throughout the afternoon, departmental receptions were held as were Alumni Soccer and Baseball games. A group exhibition featuring the graphics work of Frank Beven '84, Nadine Parris '85, Deb Eishen '91 and Greg Gilpin '83 was on display in Klemm Gallery.

Nearly 100 alumni were guests at the Honors and Awards Banquet on Saturday evening. Three alumni were recognized for their varied contributions to the world around them.

Nadine Foley, OP, was presented the Outstanding Alumni Award for her dedication to societal betterment through service to Siena Heights and through professional achievement. Foley, a graduate from the class of 1945, has been a leader not only within the religious community, but also academically. She served as Prioress on the General Council of the Adrian Dominican Congregation, worked in a presidential capacity for the Leadership Conference of Women Religious, and served as Vicarress of the Adrian Dominicans. Most recently, Foley worked as Interim President of Siena Heights. She is currently teaching religious studies at Siena and doing historical writing for the Adrian Dominican Congregation.

Recognized for her commitment to Christian education in family, school and community life, Juanita Flores, OP, was awarded the St. Dominic Award. She is currently the Director of the Latino Catholic Pastor Center in southwest Detroit. She received her Master's in Counseling from Siena Heights in 1974. Flores is a member of the Board of Trustees at Siena Heights.

The Sister Ann Joachim Award was presented to David Ballenberger of the class of 1972. This award recognizes outstanding civic and community involvement and leadership. Ballenberger is the Executive Director of Camp Oakland Youth Programs, Inc., a residential and community-based treatment agency for abused, neglected and delinquent youth in Oxford, Michigan.

Alumni Weekend wrapped up with Sunday brunch followed by the Alumni Association's annual board meeting. Members of the board are working on several key issues including Alumni Recruitment and an Alumni Mentoring Program.

On October 21, 1994, the New Instructional Facility was officially dedicated and named Dominican Hall. The "Wall of Honor" hangs in the first floor lobby and recognizes the generous gifts made to the Siena Heights College Vision 2000 Program.

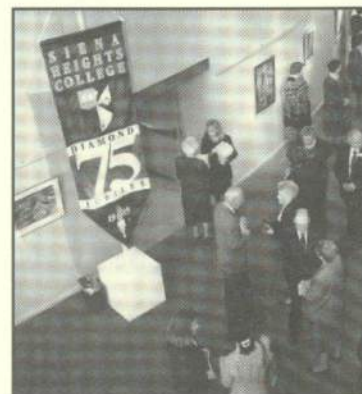

Positioning Study

Funded through a gift from the Adrian Dominican Congregation to assist the College with its marketing efforts, the College enlisted George Dehne & Associates to conduct a positioning study. The study began in March 1994. Mr. Dehne and his associates studied written information about Siena Heights including recruitment and media relations material, publications, grant documents and the North Central Report. Mr. Dehne visited the Adrian campus and interviewed over fifty members of the College community from among the faculty, staff, alumni, students, and trustees. Drawing from his investigation, Mr. Dehne outlined a set of Siena Heights College themes designed to provide a strong position for student recruitment and fund-raising efforts.

These themes are not advertising slogans or general phrases. They are descriptions of what the College believes in and offers, that should be attractive to prospective students and donors.

Mr. Dehne returned to campus in November to review the proposed positioning themes with various members of the College community. The purpose of the review was to secure consensus from the College community about what themes are appropriate to the College's history and ethos. Now that consensus has been achieved, selected themes will be featured in the College's promotional materials.

The following excerpts from the Dehne report describe the positioning themes derived from the study.

Theme One: The Distance Each Student Travels

"The Adrian Dominicans are an order that believes in the importance of each individual....Siena Heights takes pride in how far 'each student travels'. In other words, the College judges its success by the progress each individual makes....Siena Heights is not an institution of mass production. It educates one student at a time."

Theme Two: From Student to Professional

"Siena Heights provides a carefully constructed foundation from which students make the transition from student to professional - regardless of the career they choose...Even the mission statement claims that an objective of the College is to 'maintain a process through which students will explore career options and clarify their own career expectations.' Its dedication to making students not only employable but professional is a focus seen at very few colleges."

Theme Three: A Mission with Meaning

"We have read more than 150 college mission statements, but Siena Heights' mission is the first we have read that actually means something...It is as if other mission statements were written with the expectation that time would stand still. This is not the case with the Siena Heights' mission statement. It is both specific and futuristic. It also works. With each student group, we asked about the mission point-by-point to determine if they believed they were gaining the exposure and knowledge it professes. Except for a statement or two, students could describe how the mission works and lives."

Theme Four: Beyond Traditional Advising

"Many people inside and outside higher education assume that all small colleges advise students well. Generally, this is not the case. Siena Heights is one of only a handful of our sixty or more small college clients that insists on and provides excellent advising - academic, career, and pre-professional...the Siena Heights professors are credited with offering personal help themselves or seeing that students utilize the myriad of support services available. The advising program also recognizes that different constituencies have varying needs for advising. Furthermore, Siena Heights is among a very few colleges that recognizes that career counseling, personal interests, and academic advising are integrally linked."

Theme Five: "Community" as an Educational Advantage

"There is much talk about the Siena Heights community. Students and faculty regularly talked about how nice everyone is at Siena Heights. The sense of sharing and warmth were appreciated by nearly all we encountered...All this led us to wonder if a genuine, open, and unpretentious place makes any difference to the quality of the educational and academic experience? At Siena Heights, we think it does. Students take time to help their peers. Faculty seem to be and are accessible, thus encouraging students to take more risks, or, at least, get help."



News From the President's Office

Enrollment

I am pleased to report that enrollment figures for fall semester were up at all campuses. The Adrian campus had 1174 students enrolled at 4% ahead of last year and 11% ahead of our budget projections. 720 of the 1174 students were registered, full-time undergraduate students. There were 31 full-time graduate students registered for first semester. We had 181 students in this year's freshmen class. Similar success has been achieved at our off campus sites where total head count was 21% ahead of last year and credit hours were 22% ahead of last year. External site enrollments were 9% ahead of budget projections.



Gifts and Grants

Siena Heights has been the recipient of several foundation gifts and grants. Each of these generous gifts to the College speak to the dedication and academic traditions of Siena Heights.

The Lilly Foundation has awarded a \$150,000 grant over a three year period to strengthen programs at the College in the area of cultural and ethnic diversity. Siena Heights is one of 10 Midwestern independent colleges and universities to qualify for this grant to improve campus climate in a concerted effort to attract and graduate more ethnic and racial minority students. This is the second prestigious Lilly Foundation grant the College has received in 10 years.

The Mathematics Division has received an Instrumentation & Laboratory Improvement Program grant funded by the National Science Foundation. This \$20,000 grant will be used for the integration of *Mathematica*, a computer software program for algebra,

into the existing Mathematics and Science curriculum. Administrators from the National Science Foundation report that only 65 grants were awarded to colleges and universities nationwide.

The Herrick Foundation has contributed \$500,000 to the endowment fund. It has been designated for scholarships for female students in honor of former President Sr. Cathleen Real.

A special gift of \$150,000 from the Adrian Dominican Congregation has been presented to Siena Heights. Half of these funds have been designated for endowment and the remaining \$75,000 has been earmarked for physical improvements to the campus.

The Stranahan-Rueckert Challenge has been issued to alumni, faculty, staff and friends of Siena Heights. The Challenge will match gifts made by first time donors at the \$75 amount and above.

At the October 1994 meeting of the Siena Heights College Board of Trustees, it was announced that **John P. Tierney**, Chairman of Chrysler Financial Corporation in Southfield, had been appointed Chairperson of the Board, succeeding Andrew G. Creamer. Tierney has been a member of the Board since 1979 and was Co-Chair of the *Vision 2000* Wall of Honor Campaign. Most recently he served as Vice Chairperson. **Douglas Kapnick** was appointed Vice Chairperson of the Board. Kapnick, President of Kapnick and Company, Inc., has been a member of the Board of Trustees since 1985. He has served as Co-Chair of the *Vision 2000* Campaign and was Chairperson of the Presidential Search Committee.

Three new board members were approved at the October meeting. **J. Patrick Murphy, C.M.**, of Chicago, Illinois, is the Director of the Public Services Graduate

Program at DePaul University in Chicago where he is also an Associate Professor. Murphy recently authored the book *Vision and Values in Catholic Higher Education*. **Edward J. Nussel** of Toledo, Ohio, brings a great deal of experience to the Siena Heights Board. Nussel held several positions at The University of Toledo including Associate Dean of Graduate Studies and Research, Associate Dean of Academic Affairs and Professor of Education. **Byron Stickles** of Maumee, Ohio, is a Siena Heights alumnus with a bachelor's and two master's degrees from Siena Heights. He brings a wealth of business experience to the Board. He is former president and owner of Styl-Rite Lamp Shade Corporation in Toledo, Ohio, as well as a General Agent for both Wabash and Norfolk & Western Railroads. Each new trustee was appointed to a three-year term.

New Administrators

Three key administrative positions have been filled since August.

Charlie Gregory has been named Dean of Admissions and Financial Aid. Gregory brings vast admissions and financial aid experience from Cumberland University in Lebanon, Tennessee.



Stephen Goddard accepted the position of Associate Dean of Academic Affairs - Metropolitan Detroit Program. Previously he worked for Oakland Community College.



Sharon Robertello has been appointed Business Manager and Treasurer. She comes to Siena Heights from Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture in Doylestown, Pennsylvania, where she was Comptroller. Robertello replaces Robert Howard who retired after 17 years of service to Siena Heights College.



We welcome these three individuals, their insights, and experience into the Siena family.

News of Faculty and Staff

Dr. Dominic Scibilia, Assistant Professor of Religious Studies and Co-Director of the Spirituality Institute at Siena Heights College, was invited by Oxford University Press to contribute entries on American Social Catholics, Edward McGlynn and John A. Ryan, for its new *American National Biography* reference work.

The College Theology Society has also invited Dr. Scibilia to present a paper on *Teaching American Catholic History* at its 1995 national conference to be held at Holy Cross in Worcester, Massachusetts.

Perspective: A Journal for the Reformed Tradition asked Dr. Scibilia to review George Weigel's and Robert Royal's text *Democracy, Capitalism, and Catholic Social Teaching*.

Donna Milbauer '89, Art Department, currently has work on exhibition at the Laguna Gloria Art Museum in Austin, Texas. The show, entitled *Self Possessed*, was curated by Lynn Zelevansky from the Museum of Modern Art, New York. She viewed 5000 slides by over 1200 artists to make her 55 selections. Once the show ends, selected work, including art by Milbauer, will tour throughout the state of Texas until December 1996.

Milbauer was also part of a group exhibition of regional artists, including Janet Rodgers and Denise Keeley '88 from Adrian, showing their work at Angelwood Gallery in Grand Rapids, Ohio, last December.

Works by Milbauer have also been chosen to be in an exhibition entitled *Wise Women* at the Woman Made Gallery in Chicago, Illinois. The show ran during the month of October 1994.

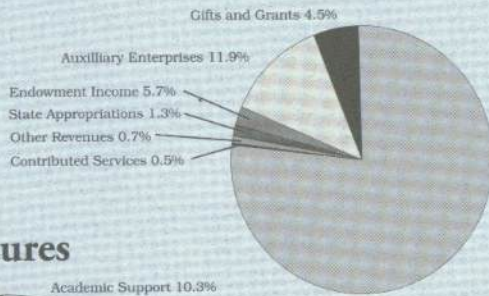

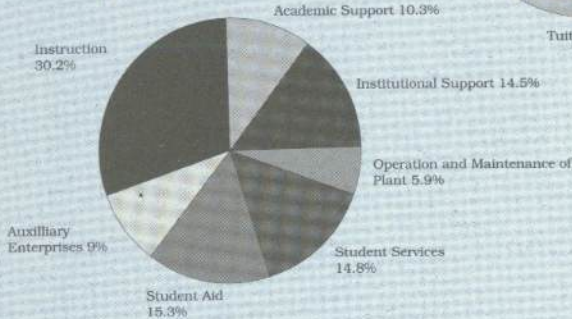

It is customary in this section of the Annual Report to highlight the accomplishments of the past year, and there were many. However, since much of last year was devoted to planning and launching several new initiatives, I will address how well the most significant new initiative--- the new annual fund (**SIENA HEIGHTS FUND - 75**) ---is faring half-way into the new fiscal year.

SIENA HEIGHTS FUND - 75 is a series of activities designed to secure unrestricted operating support from all constituencies. As a program, its components include personal visits, direct mail and phone solicitation. Each gift received underwrites a portion of every line item in the operating budget---from library acquisitions and faculty salaries to scholarships and utility costs.

During fiscal year 1993-1994, the college received \$552,653 from all sources to help underwrite an operating budget of \$12,228,591. To keep the Siena experience at quality level, the operating budget was increased to \$12,678,441 and the annual fund gift portion increased to \$650,000. The **SIENA HEIGHTS FUND - 75** goal of \$650,000 represents a 17.7 percent increase over last year's attainment. As such, it is a formidable objective. How well are we faring?

As of December 31, 1994, receipts and pledges total \$446,740. Although already at 69% of goal, it's important to note that most larger commitments are already secured. Much of the early success can be attributed to:

- * renaming the fund the **SIENA HEIGHTS FUND - 75**, and more carefully articulating its importance.
- * restructuring gift clubs from five to four and specifically asking each constituent to consider membership in one of the three clubs.
- * securing \$100,000 in grants to challenge alumni and friends to increase the number of donors and the size of gifts.
- * employing the \$100,000 Stranahan/Rueckert Challenge to provide maximum incentive for new and increased giving.

We still have over \$200,000 yet to raise to reach the \$650,000 **SIENA HEIGHTS FUND - 75** goal by June 30th, and we are about half-way towards capturing the \$100,000 in challenge dollars. I ask each of our alumni and friends to consider the importance of this effort and give as their ability permits. Remember, the College will receive \$100,000 by June 30, 1995, to match the following gifts:

PRESIDENT'S CABINET	\$1,000 for each member contributing \$1,000 or more who was not a member last year.
LUMEN SOCIETY	\$150 for each member contributing \$150 - \$999 who did not contribute a minimum of \$150 last year.
ANNIVERSARY CLUB	\$75 for each member contributing \$75 - \$149 who did not contribute a minimum of \$75 last year.
\$1 to \$75 GROUP	\$20 for each donor who did not contribute last year.

From Saints' Soccer to the Rockers

Siena's Crawford Makes an Incredible Journey to the Pro Ranks

Nine years ago he was a freshman leading Siena Heights College to its first regional championship and only trip to the NAIA National Championship Tournament. Now, he's preparing for his second season with the Detroit Rockers of the National Professional Soccer League (NPSL).

During those nine years he's had his share of bad breaks and good breaks. He's been on the verge of quitting a few times and he's been knocked around. Through it all he's been a determined winner living out a childhood fantasy.

It all began in 1985 when the Siena Heights College Men's Soccer Team made its first and only appearance at the national tournament. The team had only been competing on the varsity level for two seasons. A tribute to former Siena Heights coach Doug Mello and a speedy forward from Three Rivers named Andrew Crawford.

Crawford went on to score 63 goals and 163 points in a stellar four-year career-- numbers that may never be matched by another Saint's soccer player. He was a first-team All-American as a junior in 1987 and an honorable mention selection as a senior (despite having his best ever season with 21 goals and 51 points).

After graduating in the spring of 1989, Crawford began a five year odyssey that sent him literally across the country trying out for professional soccer teams in cities like Dayton, Dallas, Phoenix and Denver. His persistence paid off last year when the Rockers signed Crawford to a three-year contract.

Crawford endured a lot of setbacks during his struggle to reach his "childhood dream" of playing professional soccer. Fresh out of college, he tried out with the Dallas Sidekicks and the Dayton Dynamos and was cut by both teams. He spent two seasons (1990-92) playing semi-professional soccer with the Colorado Comets.

After the '92 season with the Comets, Crawford was about to give up his dream when he got an invitation to tryout for the Denver Thunder, a professional indoor soccer team. "I always felt like I could play at the professional level," said Crawford. "After a few bad breaks, I was

close to quitting...I needed one good break and I got that with the Thunder."

Crawford made the most out his good fortune. In his first season with Denver, he scored twenty-five goals and was named to the NPSL All-Rookie Team. That summer ('93) Crawford played for the Arizona Sandsharks of the Continental Indoor Soccer League (CISL) and was looking forward to returning to Thunder in the fall for his second season.

It looked as if Crawford was going to be victim of another bad break when the Denver franchise folded before the season started. Fortunately, he was selected by the Rockers in a special, league-wide draft of Thunder players.

"When someone told me that the Rockers had picked me up, I was excited because I knew I'd be close to my family, friends and my old Siena buddies," said Crawford.

He began the '93-'94 season as a starter for the Rockers and had high expectations until encountering another bad break-- his leg -- in Detroit's first home game. Crawford spent over half his season on the sidelines waiting for his leg to mend, and returned late in the year as a spot starter. Undaunted by last year's misfortune, Crawford has set lofty goals for the upcoming season. "I want to win back my starting spot and score 100 points this year," said Crawford. "I know it won't be easy, but if I stay healthy I know it's attainable."

A philosophy major who graduated from Siena Heights with honors, Crawford is realistic about how long he can continue living out his childhood fantasy. "I'd like to play for about six more years, but anything after four I would consider a bonus," he said.

As for life after the Rockers, he hopes his next career choice still includes the game he loves. "I would really like to coach soccer at the college level, but if that doesn't happen I'd like to teach and coach high school soccer," Crawford said.

As he watched his former team beat Adrian College last fall, one had to wonder if Crawford was thinking back to his days as a Saint. "We had some great teams back then and a lot of great times," said Crawford, sitting on the sidelines with his wife Trish and their two year old son, Ian.

As they watched the game, a few of Siena's "old timers" came by to shake hands with the College's most famous soccer alum. recent work in an inheritance/rape case that has made national news. Noe's client, Diane Burkhard, was conceived fifty years ago when her mother, Genevieve Rindfield, was raped by her employer, John Brooks. When Brooks, who never admitted to fathering Burkhard, died in 1992, Noe and her colleague, Timothy Pickard, went before the Michigan House of Representatives and Senate to invoke a new law stating that a child conceived during non-consensual sexual intercourse may never be precluded from inheritance from the natural father. Michigan was the first state to invoke the new law, and other states are following the precedent. Noe says she "will always have a great deal of pride" for her part in changing the law. Another controversial aspect of the case was the use of DNA testing on Brook's exhumed body to prove he was indeed Burkhard's father. Noe says, that apart from inheriting \$90,000 from Brooks' estate, her client had a strong need to know for sure who her father was. Noe, Pickard, and their clients have appeared on television and radio talk shows (including Eye to Eye and Maury Povich) and have been interviewed by magazines. According to Noe, Burkhard and her mother are happy about the publicity because "they want to affect a change."

One of the first of five psychology majors to graduate from Siena, Noe felt that she "grew up there....It

prepared me for anything. I knew I could be a doctor or senator, or whatever I wanted to be." Noe's first job after graduation was as an occupational therapist assistant at Bixby Hospital, working in substance abuse and pediatrics. In 1977 Noe married her husband, Bill, and began a new job for Lenawee Intermediate School District coordinating youth summer programs and adult programs. After three years at that job, Noe says she realized "at that point everything I did, I'd seek to master and then I became bored." Therefore, Noe decided to take the LSAT. "I wanted to look at a profession that would allow me the status and opportunity to make changes. I knew enough about myself to know I wanted to make changes." Two weeks after taking the LSAT, Noe was courted by the Detroit College of Law, which was the only school accepting new students in January. When Noe graduated from law school in 1983, she began her practice in Adrian - which she considered her home even though she was raised in a Chicago suburb.

During 1985, the Noes began their family in an unorthodox manner. In March they adopted ten-year-old Christopher. Two weeks later, a death in the family left Noe's twelve-year-old nephew, Eric, in need of a home, so they also adopted him. Within the next month, Noe discovered she was pregnant and Charles was born eight

months later. "I feel very fortunate to have all three boys; they've made our lives far more meaningful," Noe commented. Because of their adopted sons, the Noes are especially sensitive to adoption issues. "That's one of our causes," Noe stated.

Besides her family responsibilities and busy case load, Noe also finds time to be a member of many service organizations. She is president of both the Sage Advisory Council and Adrian Civil Service Commission, is past president of Catholic Social Services, serves on the Lenawee County Sexual Abuse Task Force, is a member of the United Way Team, St. Joseph Academy Advisory Council, and Right of Christian Initiation for Adults, is Assistant Prosecuting Attorney for Lenawee County, is on the LISD long range planning committee, and was recently asked to join the Adrian Training School Board. In addition to serving on multiple committees, Noe also teaches regularly at Adrian College and at Jackson Community College's Lenawee Center. Noe is especially thrilled about being asked to teach at Siena this semester. "It's like going home," said Noe.

Noe, who is the epitome of Siena's mission "to assist people to become more competent, purposeful and ethical," will now have the opportunity to impart those values to fresh crops of Siena students.
