Falling in Step With Siena

Siena Heights alumni enjoyed a variety of opportunities to meet, greet, eat and explore ideas during the fall semester:

- A September event for Lenawee County alumni offered guests a chance to meet with President Rick Artman and learn more about the College's efforts to enhance diversity with a grant from the Lilly Endowment. The Sunday brunch was followed by a provocative presentation by Native American performance artist James Luna of the Luiseno/Diegueno tribes and a visit to Klemm Gallery to view "Native America: Reflecting Contemporary Realities."

- In October, as we turned back the clocks, Alumni Weekend '96 invited friends to "Fall Back in Step with Siena." The Classes of '66 and '71 took the invitation literally, when they took to the stage with musician Rick Kelley Saturday night: The '66 alumnae performed an impressive "slide" in step with a Motown medley, while a select group of '71 grads donned dark glasses to perform choreographed backup for "Under the Boardwalk." Other highlights: Saturday morning's golf outing, the 50-Year/Golden Years Reunion Breakfast, stress seminars sponsored by Graduate Studies, baseball and basketball contests, the "Alumni Invitational" at Flatlanders Art Gallery in Blissfield, and Sunday's alumni liturgy. Plan now to fall back in step with us next year!

- "Ancient Art & Alma Mater" brought graduates and friends from southeast Michigan and northwest Ohio to the Toledo Museum of Art November 15 for a Siena reception in conjunction with "The Fire of Hephaistos," an exhibit of bronze sculpture from ancient Greece and Rome. (Artemis, goddess of the hunt, is shown at left.) Honorary host Alice Robie Resnick '61, Justice of the Supreme Court of Ohio, invited alumni to meet friends, sample Greek and Italian hors d'oeuvres, and enjoy a presentation by John Wittersheim of the art faculty on the history and technology of bronze casting--and 135 people accepted the invitation, with dozens more disappointed to find the reservation list already full. More such events are under consideration.

In response, many colleges and universities have passed those increases on to their students in the form of increased tuition.

In a continuing effort to keep a Siena Heights education affordable, this College has chosen other options. One such option is the Siena Heights College Annual Fund.

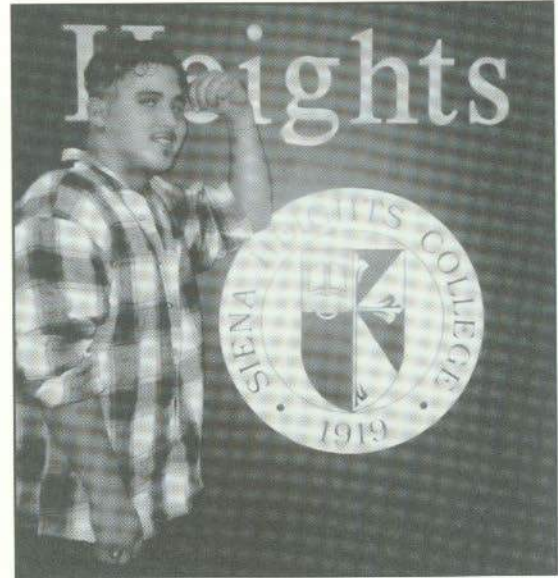

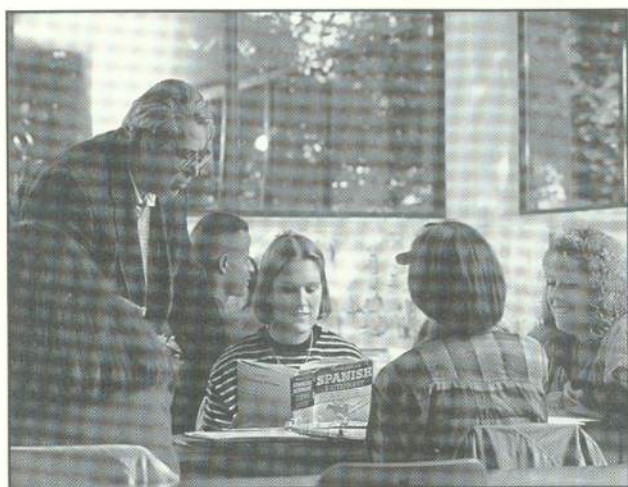

Setting Sights on Success in Higher (and Higher) Education

Trio Programs, which are federally funded instructional programs designed to help low-income, first-generation college students succeed in higher education, continue to thrive at Siena Heights. Three such programs are administered by the College. Upward Bound, now in its 22nd year of operation, assists high school students preparing for college. Student Support Services, in its 17th year, assists college students enrolled at Siena to complete their baccalaureate degrees. The McNair Scholars Program, now in its fifth year, helps Siena students who represent groups traditionally under-represented in graduate school to prepare for future success earning doctoral degrees. Annual funding for these programs from the U.S. Department of Education totals more than \$600,000.

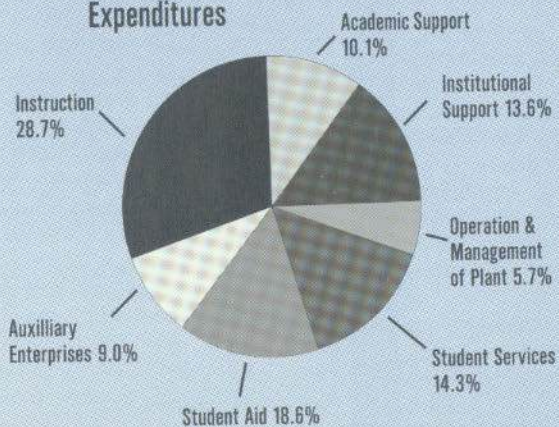

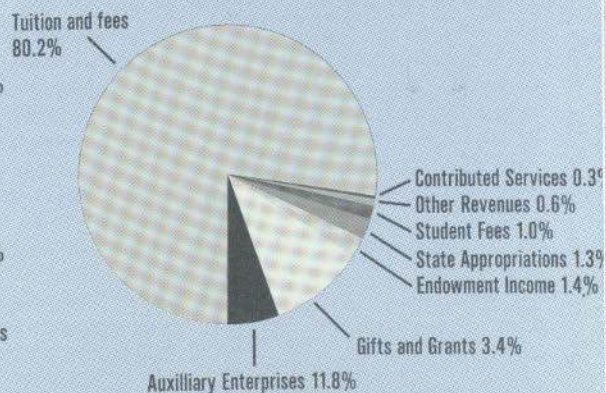

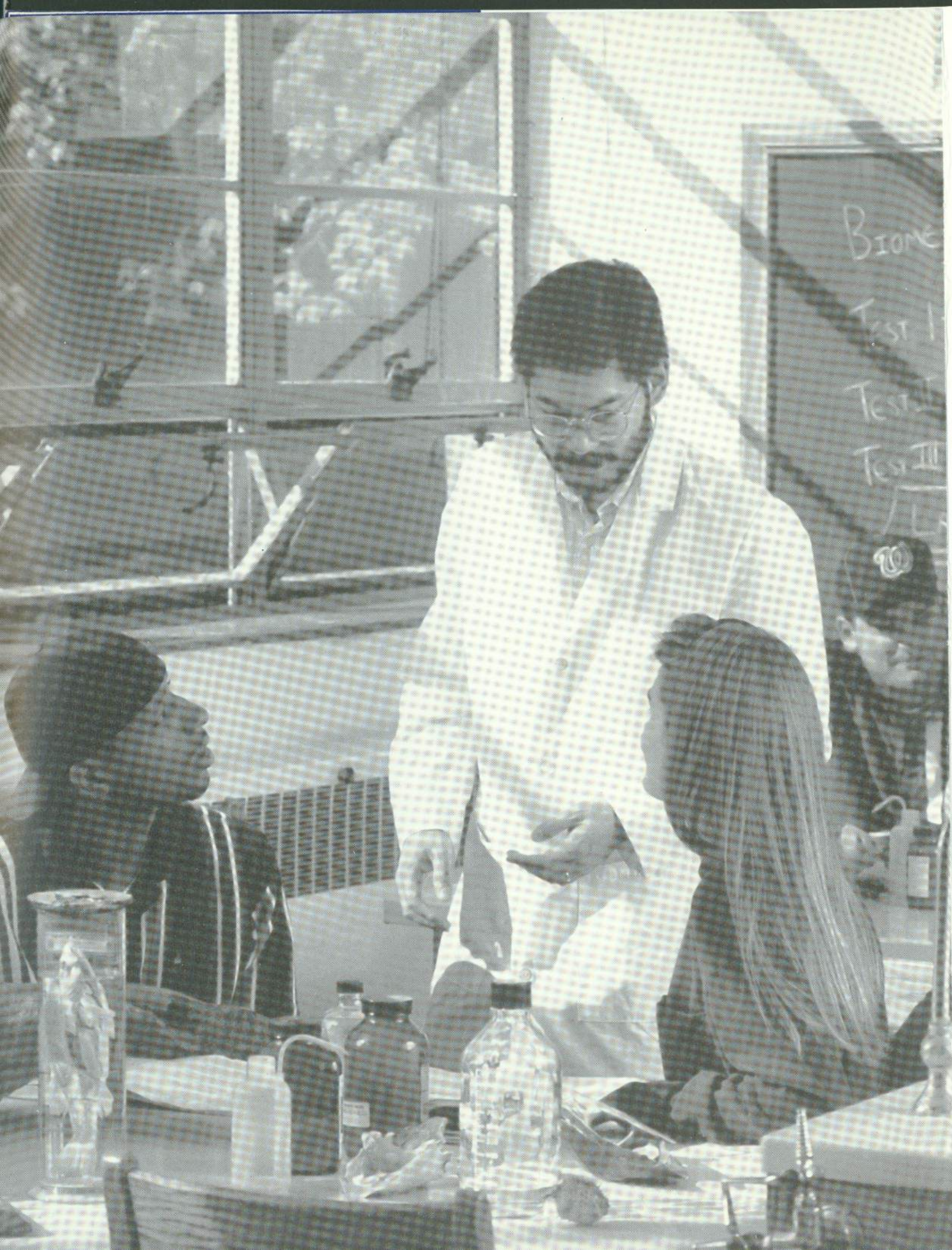

Norm Bukwaz, dean of off-campus programs, oversees operations at all six degree-completion centers. His office is located on the main campus in Adrian.

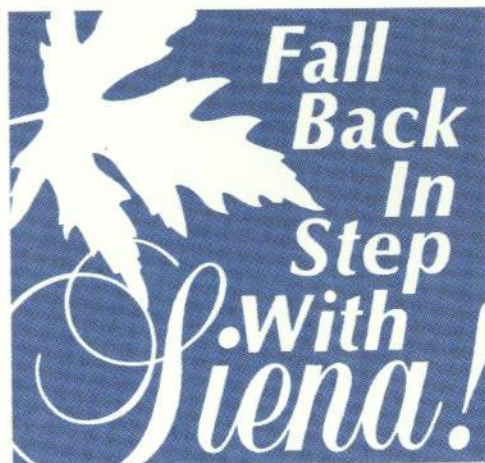
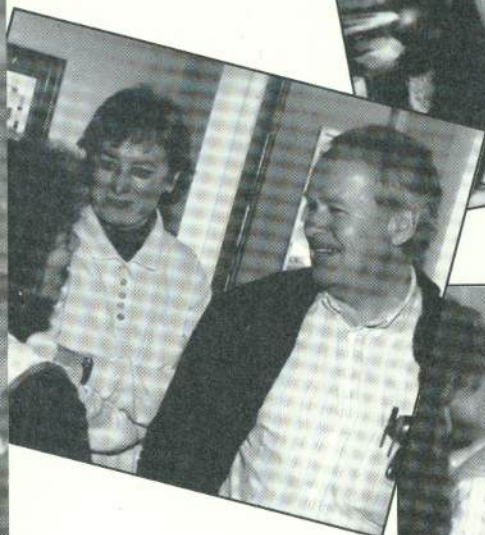
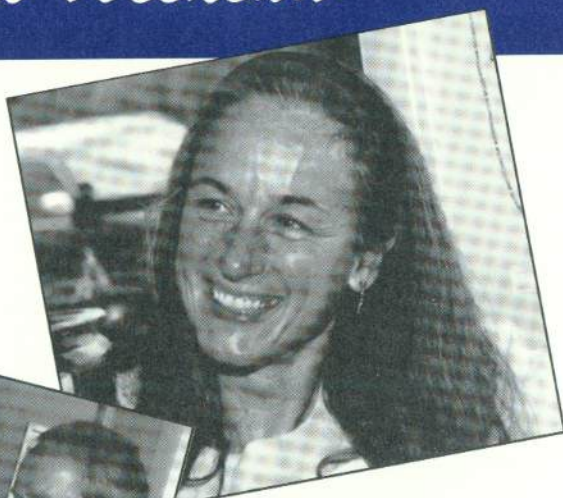
Metro Detroit Expands East Side Offerings
