ANNUAL DISCLOSURE OF CRIME STATISTICS

Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety prepares this report to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act. The full text of this report can be located on our web site at www.sienaheights. edu. Hard copies are also available by contacting Public Safety at 517.264.7800. This report is prepared in cooperation with the local law enforcement agencies surrounding our main campus and alternate sites, Residence Life, the Student Conduct Officer, the Division of Student Life, SHU TIPS, and Campus Security Authorities [(CSA) see page 93 of this document]. Siena Heights University's internal collaboration for policy disclosure and updated trainings is an annual review with, but not limited to, Title IX Advisory Board, Conduct Office, Site Directors, Human Resources, Student Activities, and

CARE team.

Campus crime, arrest, and referral statistics include those reported to SHU DPS, designated CSA (including but not limited to deans, judicial affairs, advisors to student organizations, site directors, athletic coaches, student services directors), and local law enforcement agencies. These statistics may also include crimes that have occurred in private residences or businesses and is not required by law.

Each year, an e-mail notification is made via the Siena Heights University broadcast e-mail system notifying faculty/staff/students of the availability of the safety handbook and crime statistics for the previous three calendar years. All prospective employees may obtain a copy from the University web site at www.sienaheights.edu or request a hard copy from Public Safety at 517.264.7800.

Sixty day crime log (updated within two business days) for the Adrian campus is available at the Welcome Center in the lobby of Ledwidge Hall, open twenty-four hours a day. All other campuses crime logs are available through the host campus safety departments (see Emergency Services section of this document). Crime logs do not contain personal identifying information and will not be included in published record keeping.

This Annual Safety Report covers all of the Siena Heights University campuses, all policy disclosers and procedures are applicable to all students and employees on all campuses unless specifically noted as different.

SIENA HEIGHTS UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Department of Public Safety is located in Ledwidge Hall on the Adrian Campus. There is a trained Public Safety Officer available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The Director of Public Safety's office is located in Ledwidge Hall. The Public Safety/Welcome Center is staffed with dispatch/phone operators and trained Public Safety Officers.

Officers are trained in many aspects of crime prevention and community service. Officers are certified in Standard First Aid, AED and CPR. Siena Heights University Public Safety Officers do not have arrest authority; they cooperate and work closely with the law enforcement agencies that have jurisdiction for each campus. For the Adrian campus, the following agencies have jurisdiction: Adrian Police Department, Lenawee County Sheriff Department, and the Michigan State Police. For the Lake Michigan College Center, the following agencies have jurisdiction: City of Benton Harbor Police, Berrien County Sheriff Department, and the Michigan State Police. For the Monroe Campus, the following agencies have jurisdiction: City of Monroe Police Department, Monroe County Sheriff Department and the Michigan State Police. For the Jackson Campus, the following agencies have jurisdiction: City of Jackson Police Department, the Jackson County Sheriff Department, and the Michigan State Police. For the Kellogg Campus, the following agencies have jurisdiction: the City of Battle Creek Police Department, the Calhoun County Sheriff Department. For the Dearborn Center, the following agencies have jurisdiction: City of Dearborn Police Department, Wayne County Sheriff Department, and the Michigan State Police. For the Kalamazoo campus, the following agencies have jurisdiction: City of Kalamazoo Police Department, Kalamazoo County Sheriff Department, and the Michigan State Police. None of the Siena Heights University campuses have sworn police departments with arrest authority. All of the Siena Heights University campuses (including host campuses) public safety and/or security jurisdiction is confined to the campus Clery geography.

The Siena Heights University Public Safety Department is committed to providing you with respectful and professional service. While we can promise you a committed effort to ensure your safety, we are of course unable to promise total isolation from crime. Therefore, it is important that each of you takes responsibility for your own safety. The key to preventing crime is awareness which is best achieved through education. Please take time to read through this handbook and familiarize yourself with the programs and activities we offer. Educate yourself about what you can do personally to make your campus a safer place. If you have any questions concerning your safety at Siena Heights University, please do not hesitate to call us at 517.264.7800. We are here to assist and protect you. Together, we can combat crime.

To contact local law enforcement call 911 from an outside line or 9-911 from an Adrian campus phone line. Community members are expected to report any criminal activity as quickly and as accurately as possible to a Campus Public Safety Officer when the victim of a crime elects to, or is unable to, make such a report. If calling 911, Adrian campus community members are asked to call Public Safety and advise the Officer on duty so that they can assist the emergency response personnel.

CRIME REPORTING

Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety encourages anyone who is the victim or witness to any crime to promptly report the incident to Public Safety when the victim of a crime elects to or is unable to. Because Siena Heights University cooperates with local law enforcement no crime reports can be held in confidence. All reports will be investigated. The University does not have procedures for voluntary, confidential reporting of crime statistics. A local system for confidential criminal reports can be made to Lenawee County Crime Stoppers at 517.266.6161. Siena Heights University Public Safety works with campus pastoral counselors and campus professional counselors to inform, when deemed appropriate, their clients how to report crimes or criminal activity.

Criminal Activity Off Campus

When a Siena Heights University student is involved in an off-campus offense, Siena Heights University Public Safety Officers may assist with the investigation in cooperation with local, state, or federal law enforcement. The Adrian Police Department routinely works and communicates with campus officers on any serious incidents occurring on-campus or in the immediate neighborhood surrounding campus. Siena Heights University does not have any off-campus housing or off-campus student organization facilities. Officially recognized student organizations do not own or control any property so there is no need for and no monitoring of criminal activity. While the Adrian Police Department has primary jurisdiction in all areas off campus, Siena Public Safety Officers have direct communication with the local authorities to facilitate rapid response in any emergency situation.

CRIME STATISTICS — 2022 • 2023 • 2024

Siena Heights University has multiple locations. The main campus is located in Adrian, Michigan. The Jackson, Monroe, Lansing, Dearborn, and Battle Creek centers are located on host campuses which have their own public safety. Each host campus provides its own Right to Know Act statistics, which include any crimes that may have been related to the Siena Heights University centers. The following data is for the SHU program only, not the entire host campus (except Adrian and former Southfield campuses). For complete statistics for the degree completion centers please contact their public safety departments (numbers provided in the emergency services section of this book).

DEFINITIONS:

Aggravated Assault: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm (Clery).

Arrest: Person processed by arrest, citation or summons (Clery).

Arson: Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another etc (Clery).

Burglary: The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft (Clery).

Campus: (1) Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area and used by the institution in direct support or, or in a manner related to, the institution's education al purposes, including residence halls; and (2) Any building or property that is within or reasonably contiguous to paragraph (1) of this definition, that is owned by the institution but controlled by another person, is frequently used by students, and supports institutional purposes (such as a food or other retail vendor) (Clery).

<u>Category of Fire:</u> for HEA purposes, there are three categories of fire: Unintentional Fire: A fire that does not involve an international human act to ignite or spread fire into an area where the fire should not be. Intentional Fire: A fire that is ignited, or that results from a deliberate action, in circumstances where the person knows there should not be a fire. Undetermined Fire: A fire that is ignited, or that results from a deliberate action, in circumstances where the person knows there should not be a fire (Clery).

<u>Cause of Fire:</u> The factor of factors that five rise to a fire. The causal factor may be, but it is not limited to, the result of an intentional or unintentional action, mechanical failure or act of nature (Clery).

<u>Consent:</u> Must be informed, freely given and mutual. If coercion, intimidation, threats or physical force are used there is no consent. If a person is mentally or physically incapacitated or impaired so that such person cannot understand the fact, nature or extent of the sexual situation, there is no consent: this includes impairment or incapacitation due to alcohol or drug consumption, or being asleep or unconscious.

Inducement of incapacitation of another with the intent to affect the ability of an individual to consent or refuse to consent to sexual contact almost always, if not always, negates consent. Silence does not necessarily constitute consent. Whether a person has taken advantage of a position of influence over an alleged victim may be a factor in determining consent (Siena).

There are four different ways in which a person is unable to give consent with regard to criminal sexual conduct according to the Michigan Penal Code:

- 1. The person is underage. In the State of Michigan, the age of consent is 16. People who engage in sexual activity with children who are underage can be charged with statutory rape, which is also called criminal sexual conduct in Michigan. Even if a person under the age of 16 has agreed to a sexual relationship or has pursued the act, the defendant can still face criminal charges.
- 2. The person is intoxicated. A person who has consumed too much alcohol is unable to give consent to sexual activity. Researchers have found that alcohol facilitated rape is the most common form of sexual violence against women.
- 3. The person who has a developmental disability. According to the Michigan Penal Code, a developmental disability is defined as a person has an impairment of the general intellectual functioning or adaptive behavior that originated before they were 18 years of age, continued since it was first originated, constitutes a substantial burden to the impaired persons' ability to perform in society. That could include individuals with cerebral palsy, epilepsy, or autism.
- 4. The person was given a date rape drug. A date rape drug, also known as a predator rape, is considered a sexual assault carried out when a person has become incapacitated due to being under the influence of any mind-altering substances. (State of Michigan).

Dating Violence: Violence committed by a person (1) who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim, and (2) the existence of such a relationship shall be based on the reporting party's statement and with consideration of the length of the relationship, the type of the relationship, and the frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship. For the purposes of this definition dating violence includes, but is not limited to, sexual or physical abuse or the threat of such abuse. Dating violence does not include acts covered under the definition of domestic violence (Clery) (The State of Michigan does not have a Dating Violence statute).

Domestic Violence: Felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence committed: (i) by a current or former spouse or intimate partner of the victim; (ii) by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common; (iii) by a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner; (iv) by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction in which the crime of violence occurred; or (v) by any other person against an adult or youth victim who is protected from the person's actions under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction in which the crime of violence occurred (Clery). State of Michigan: assault and assault and battery of his

or her spouse or former spouse, an individual with whom he or she has had a child in common, a resident or former resident of the same household, an individual with whom he or she has had a dating relationship, a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner, a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws, or any other person against an adult or youth victim show is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction (State of Michigan).

Felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence (including threats or attempts) committed by a current or former spouse of the victim, by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, by a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse, by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies, or by any other person against an adult or youth victim/survivor who is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies. It should be understood that domestic violence/dating violence applies to any pattern of coercive behavior that is used by one person to gain power and control over a current or former intimate partner or dating partner. This pattern of behavior may include physical or sexual violence, emotional and psychological intimidation, threats, verbal abuse, stalking, isolation, and economic control. In compiling domestic violence figures, grantees should include grant funds directed at dating violence (VAWA).

<u>Drug Abuse Violation:</u> Violation of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs. Drug paraphernalia is illegal in Lenawee County (Local Ordinance).

Economic Abuse: The term 'economic abuse', in the context of domestic violence, dating violence, and abuse in later life, means behavior that is coercive, deceptive, or unreasonably controls or restrains a person's ability to acquire, use, or maintain economic resources to which they are entitled, including using coercion, fraud, or manipulation to:

- 1. Restrict a person's access to money, assets, credit, or financial information;
- Unfairly use a person's personal economic resources, including money, assets, and credit, for one's own advantage; or
- 3. Exert undue influence over a person's financial and economic behavior or decisions, including forcing default on joint or other financial obligations, exploiting powers of attorney, guardianship, or conservatorship, or failing or neglecting to act in the best interests of a person to whom one has a fiduciary duty (VAWA).

Gender Discrimination: Discrimination or harassment based upon one's gender (sex), Sexual orientation, gender identity, sex-related characteristics (including intersex traits), status as transgender or nonbinary, or sex stereotypes. Unfair treatment, attitudes, or behaviors towards an individual based upon their gender (sex). Sexism, sexist attitudes, and sex stereotyping. Unproportionate athletic programs or activities offered all genders in relations to the college's enrollment (Title IX).

<u>Harassment:</u> Unwanted behaviors that target someone's race or ethnicity, gender identity, or sexuality that create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment (Siena).

Conduct directed toward a victim that includes, but is not limited to, repeated, or continuing unconsented contact that would cause a reasonable individual to suffer emotional distress that actually caused the victim to suffer emotional distress. Harassment does not include constitutional protected activity or conduct that serves a legitimate purpose (State of Michigan).

Unwanted sexual behavior, advances, or requests for favors. Unwelcomed verbal, visual, or physical sexual conduct. Offensive, severe, and/or frequent remarks about a person's sex. Harassment of a sexual nature which interferes with an individual's right an education and participating in a program or activity (Title IX).

Hostile Environment: is one in which unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature creates an uncomfortable, intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment (Siena).

Hate Crime (bias crime): A criminal offense that manifests evidence that the victim was intentionally selected because of the perpetrator's bias against the victim. For the purposes of Clery, the categories of bias include the victim's actual or perceived race, religion, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, ethnicity, national origin, and disability (Clery).

<u>Hazing:</u> any action or situation, whether on or off University premises, which:

- Endangers the mental health, physical health, or safety of a person,
- Embarrasses, frightens, or degrades a person,
- Destroys or removes public or private property

For the purposes of initiation, admission into, affiliate with, or as a condition of continued membership in a student organization, group, or team regardless of an individual's willingness to participate (Clery).

<u>Intimidation:</u> To unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct, but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack (Clery).

<u>Larceny-Theft:</u> The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Constructive possession is the condition in which a person does not have physical custody or possession, but is in a position to exercised dominion or control over a thing (Clery).

Liquor Law Violations: The violation of state or local laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use of alcoholic beverages, not including driving under the influence and drunkenness. Include in this classification: the manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing, etc. of intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating still; furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; drinking on train or public conveyance; and attempts to commit any of the above (Clery).

<u>MDOP/Vandalism</u>: Malicious destruction of property. To willfully or maliciously destroy, damage, deface, or otherwise injure real or personal property without the consent of the owner or the person having custody or control of it (Clery).

Motor Vehicle Theft: The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle (Clery).

<u>Murder/Non-negligent Manslaughter:</u> The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another (Clery).

<u>Negligent Manslaughter:</u> The killing of another person through gross negligence (Clery).

Non Campus Building or Property: (1) Any building or property owned or controlled by a student organization that is officially recognized by the institution; or (2) Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution that is used in direct support of, or in relation to, the institution's educational purposes, is frequently used by students, and is not within the same reasonably geographic area of the institution (Clery).

On-Campus Student Housing Facility: Any student housing facility that is owned or controlled by the institution, or is located on property that is owned or controlled by the institution, and is within the reasonably contiguous geographic area that makes up the campus is considered an on-campus student housing facility (Clery).

<u>Property Damage:</u> The estimated value of the loss of the structure and contents, in terms of the cost of replacement in like kind and quantity. This estimate should include contents damaged by fire, ad related damages caused by smoke, water, and overhaul, however, it does not include indirect loss, such as business interruption (Clery).

<u>Public Property:</u> All public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, that is within the campus, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus (Clery).

Referred for Disciplinary Action: The referral of any person to any official who initiates a disciplinary action of which a record is established and which may result in the imposition of a sanction (Clery).

Retaliation: Retaliation against any individual for reporting an individual providing information, or exercising one's rights or responsibilities. Retaliation includes but is not limited to intimidation, threats, coercion, or discrimination against any individual, undertaken or attempted, directly or someone acting on behalf of another. This policy also applies to retaliation against individual's involved in the process of responding to, investigating, or addressing allegations of sexual discrimination, harassment, violence, or participating in any University process (Clery).

<u>Risk Reduction:</u> Options designed to decrease perpetration and bystander inaction, and to increase empowerment for victims in order to promote safety and to help individuals and communities address conditions that facilitate violence (Clery).

Robbery: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by

putting the victim in fear (Clery).

<u>Sexual Assault:</u> An offense that meets the definition of rape, fondling, incest, or statutory rape as used in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting system. A sex offense is any act directed against another person's, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim if incapable of giving consent (Clery).

Criminal Sexual Conduct: Sexual Assault is any form of unwanted sexual contact obtained without consent and/or obtained through he use of force, threat of force, intimidation, or coercion.

1st degree (felony): a sexual act involving penetration (broadly defined) and any of the following:

- Victim is under 13 years old;
- Victim is 13-15 years old + is a blood affiliation to the defendant, lives in the
 defendant's household, or the defendant is in an authority position to the
 victim;
- Multiple actors are involved and forced/coercion was used to accomplish
 the sexual penetration or the victim is incapacitated (physically helpless,
 mentally incapacitated or mentally defective) weapon involved;
- Personal injury + force/coercion;
- Personal injury + victim incapacitated (unable to consent due to age, mental challenge or due to intoxication, date rape drug etc); or
- Defendant is in the process of committing another felony.

2nd degree (felony): sexual contact (no penetration) with the genital area, groin, inner thigh, buttock or breast, AND any of the circumstances listed for 1st degree CSC.

3rd degree: sexual penetration and any of the following:

- Victim is 13-15 years old;
- Force or coercion; or
- Victim is incapacitated (unable to consent due to age, mental challenge, intoxication, date rape drug, etc.);

4th degree (misdemeanor): Sexual Contact and any of the following:

- Force or Coercion;
- Victim incapacity (unable to consent due to age, mental challenges, intoxication, date rape drug, etc);
- Defendant works for the Department of Corrections and victim is an inmate (State of Michigan).

Sexual Harassment: • unwelcome, • sexual, sex-based, and/or gender-based verbal, written, online, and/or physical conduct (Clery).

<u>Sex Offenses:</u> any sexual act directed against another person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent.

- <u>Fondling:</u> The touching of the private parts of another person for the
 purpose of sexual gratification, without the consent of the victim, including
 instance where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her
 age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental incapacity (Clery).
- <u>Incest:</u> Sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law (Clery).
- Rape: The penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus, with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ to another person, without the consent of the victim (Clery).
- <u>Statutory Rape:</u> non-Forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent (Clery).

<u>Simple Assault:</u> An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness (Clery).

Stalking: Engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to: fear for the person's safety or the safety of others; or suffer substantial emotional distress. Including but not limited to willful course of conduct (a pattern of 2 or more separate acts) involving repeated or continuing harassment of another individual that would cause a reasonable person to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, fear for his or her safety or the safety of theirs, suffer substantial emotional distress or molested and that actually caused the victim to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, fear for this or her safety of the safety of others, or suffer substantial emotional distress (Clery).

A willful course of conduct involving repeated or continuing harassment of another individual that would cause a reasonable person to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, or molested and that actually causes the victim to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, or molested (State of Michigan).

Technological Abuse: An act or pattern of behavior that occurs within domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence or stalking and is intended to harm, threaten, intimidate, control, stalk, harass, impersonate, exploit, extort, or monitor, except as otherwise permitted by law, another person, that occurs using any form of information technology, including: internet enabled devices, online spaces and platforms, computers, mobile devices, cameras and imaging platforms, apps, location tracking devices, communication technologies, or any other emerging technologies (VAWA).

<u>Title IX:</u> Education Amendments Act of 1972 is a federal law that states: no person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program

or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.

- Confidential Title IX Reporting: If reporting students wish that details
 of an incident be kept confidential, they should speak with campus
 mental health counselors and/or campus priest. Campus counselors are
 available to help on an emergency basis. Their service is free of charge.
 Local resources such as crisis centers are also confidential and have no
 duty to report to the University (Siena).
- Mandated Title IX Reporting: All University employees who are not designated above as confidential, are mandated reporters for all the details of which they are aware about an incident. They share this information with Title IX Coordinator. Giving a mandated reporter notice of an incident constitutes official notice to the institution. Incidents of sexual misconduct will be taken seriously when official notice is given to the institution. Such incidents of sexual misconduct will be investigated and resolved in a prompt and equitable manner under the University policies (Siena).
- <u>Title IX Coordinator and Requests of Confidentiality:</u> Community
 members who are reporting an incident of potential Title IX violations
 to the Title IX Coordinator may request confidentiality, thus
 confidentially could be supported under certain circumstances (Siena).

Weapons, carrying, possessing, etc.: The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devises or other deadly weapons. This classification encompasses weapons offenses that are regulatory in nature. Include in this classification: manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly; using, manufacturing, etc., of silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors, aliens possessing deadly weapons; and attempts to commit any of the above. On the Siena Heights University campus weapons includes possession and/or use of firearms, knives, over 3 inches, ammunition, fireworks, gasoline, and other combustible or explosive items (including non-lethal projectile type weapons such as air soft, "bb", paint ball etc.) or the brandishing of any objects in a threatening manner on University premises are not permitted (Clery).

<u>Unfounded Crime:</u> A reported crime that upon investigation by law enforcement authorities is found to be false or baseless. Only sworn or commissioned law enforcement personnel may unfound a crime. Crime reports can be property determined to be false only if the evidence from a complete and thorough investigation establishes that the crime reported was not, in fact, completed or attempted in any manner (Clery).

SIENA HEIGHTS UNIVERSITY HAZING POLICY

Purpose: The Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA) amends the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require all colleges and universities to disclose hazing incidents in their Annual Security Reports (ASR). The SCHA mandates that all colleges and universities define hazing, compile statistics on reported cases, and establish transparent policies for reporting and prevention. The purpose of this policy is to establish Siena Heights University's Anti-Hazing Policy, notify students, coaches, faculty, staff and others in the University community about their responsibilities regarding hazing, identify how the University will implement this policy, and identify resources to assist in reporting hazing or suspected hazing and violations of this policy.

Policy Statement: Pursuant to the Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA) and Michigan's Anti-Hazing Law, MCL 750.411t (Garrett's Law), Siena Heights University does not tolerate hazing. Organizations or individuals found responsible for hazing under this policy, whether occurring on or off campus may be subject to disciplinary action including expulsion from the University, and/or civil or criminal penalties and prosecution.

Organizations include the national or parent organization of which any of the underlying entities provided for in the definition of student organizations below is a sanctioned or recognized member at the time of the hazing.

Definitions:

Student Organization: Siena Heights University prohibits students, and recognized organizations including student organizations, from engaging in hazing as defined by the federal SCHA and Michigan's Anti-Hazing Law, MCL 750.411t. An organization at Siena Heights University includes, but is not limited to: a club, society, corps, service group, association, fraternity, sorority, spirit group, athletic teams, club sports team, student government, music, band, and art organizations, and all other student groups or organizations in which two or more of the members are students enrolled in the University, whether or not the organization is established or recognized by the University,

Pledging is any action or activity related to becoming a member of an organization, including recruitment and rushing. Hazing of pledges is also strictly prohibited by the University.

Application: This policy applies to:

- Students enrolled in the University
- Minors participating in university-sponsored youth programs and educational programs
- Any organization operating as a recognized student organization by the University
- A group of two or more student members, whether or not established or recognized by the University.

Hazing is strictly prohibited at all Siena Heights University campus locations and in all activities, programs, and organizations associated with Siena Heights University, whether on or off campus. All hazing incidents will be investigated under our student code of conduct and will be handled through the student conduct office by the Dean of Students in conjunction with Siena Heights DPS and Adrian Police Department if necessary. Please refer to the student code of conduct at https://www.sienaheights.edu/wp-content/uploads/2024-2025-Student-Code-of-Conduct-Final.pdf The SCHA requires institutions of higher education to report hazing incidents on their annual security report and adopt specific policies to report hazing incidents, investigate and adjudicate hazing complaints and to help prevent hazing by establishing campus wide hazing education prevention programs.

"Hazing"-Federal Law Definition:

The SCHA defines hazing as "any intentional, knowing, or reckless act committed by a person whether individually or in concert with other persons, against another person or persons, regardless of the willingness of the other person or persons to participate, that:

I. is committed in the course of an initiation into, an affiliation with, or the maintenance of member in, a student organization; and

II. causes or creates a risk, above the reasonable risk encountered in the course of participation in the institution of higher education or the organization (such as the physical preparation necessary for participation in an athletic team), of physical or psychological injury including-

- A. whipping, beating, striking, electronic shocking, placing of a harmful substance on someone's body, or similar activity;
- B. causing, coercing or otherwise including sleep deprivation, exposure to the elements, confinement in a small space, extreme calisthenics, or other similar activity;
- C. causing, coercing or otherwise inducing another person to consume food, liquid, alcohol, drugs, or other substances;
- D. causing, coercing or otherwise inducing another person to perform sexual acts;
- E. any activity that places another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words or conduct;

F. any activity against another person that includes a criminal violation of local, State, Tribal, or Federal law; and G. any activity that induces, causes, or requires another person to perform a duty or task that involves a criminal violation of local, State, Tribal, or Federal law.

In addition to the above SCHA definitions of hazing, specific examples of acts or conduct which may constitute hazing include, but are not limited to the following:

- Forced or prolonged physical activity
- Forced alcohol or drug consumption
- Forced consumption of any food, beverage, medication, or controlled

substance more than the usual amount for human consumption, or forced consumption of any substance not generally intended for human consumption

- Verbal abuse
- Asking members to wear humiliating clothing or attire
- Sleep deprivation
- Sexual simulations
- Beating, punching, or any form of assault as means of initiation
- Branding
- Public nudity
- Exposure to extreme weather conditions without appropriate protection
- Activities that significantly interfere with class, other University obligations (e.g. athletics, etc.) work, studying, and sleep.
- Explicitly or implicitly causing, inducing, pressuring, coercing, or requiring an individual to violate any federal, state, or local law, and/or University policy
- Any action or situation which may lead to compromising an individual's selfrespect, moral or religious values, or suffering mental or emotional harm.
- Transporting individuals against their will, abduction, kidnapping, imprisoning, or abandoning an individual which endangers the health or safety of that individual.
 - Restraining or tying up individuals.
- Activities involving placement of substances on or in the body of an individual (e.g., eggs, paint, honey, etc.).
 - Lineups or interrogations.
- Pressuring individuals to get a brand, tattoo, shave their head, or modify their body in any way.
 - Assigning meaningless tasks to individuals.
- Any form of personal servitude (e.g., driving, cleaning rooms, serving meals, washing cars, purchasing items on another's behalf, etc.).
- Assigning "pranks" such as stealing, defacing property, and harassing other organizations
- Scavenger hunts for meaningless items or which promote trespassing, breaking the law, endanger members, or occur at unreasonable times.
 - Forced memorization of non-essential information.
 - Compelling any individual to wear or carry unusual or burdensome items.
- Activities intended to interfere with an individual's employment or family obligations
 - Excluding individuals from social contact.
 - Select individuals being solely responsible for an organization's obligations.
 - Requirements that financially take advantage of individuals.
- Explicitly or implicitly requiring an individual to wear any degrading, inappropriate, or uncomfortable garments.
- Conspicuous dress that is not expected of all organization members for events, activities, dress up days, etc.

Preventing individuals from wearing any required garments or accessories. State of Michigan Law on Hazing/Criminal Punishment for Hazing: https://www.legislature.mi.gov/Laws/MCL?objectName=mcl-750-411t In addition to Siena Heights University's Policy on Hazing and the disciplinary action/ penalties under the University's Student Code of Conduct, the State of Michigan has criminalized certain types of hazing at educational institutions, including colleges and universities under "Garrett's Law", MCL 750.411tUnder Garrett's Law, hazing includes an intentional, knowing, or reckless disregard act by a person acting alone or acting with others that is directed against an individual and that person knew or should have known endangers the physical health or safety of the individual, and that is done for the purpose of pledging, being initiated into, affiliating with, participating in, holding office in, or maintaining membership in any organization. It is not a defense to a prosecution under Garrett's Law that the individual against whom hazing was directed, consented or acquiesced in the hazing. The criminal definition of hazing and penalties can be found in "Garret's law" under MCL Section 750.411t. See below:

THE MICHIGAN PENAL CODE (EXCERPT) Act 328 of 1931

750.411t Hazing prohibited; violation; penalty; exceptions; certain defenses barred; definitions; section title.

Sec. 411t.

- (1) Except as provided in subsection (4), a person who attends, is employed by, or is a volunteer of an educational institution shall not engage in or participate in the hazing of an individual.
 - (2) A person who violates subsection (1) is guilty of a crime punishable as follows:
- (a) If the violation results in physical injury, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both.
- (b) If the violation results in serious impairment of a body function, the person is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 5 years or a fine of not more than \$2,500.00, or both.
- (c) If the violation results in death, the person is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 15 years or a fine of not more than \$10,000.00, or both.
- (3) A criminal penalty provided for under this section may be imposed in addition to any penalty that may be imposed for any other criminal offense arising from the same conduct.
- (4) This section does not apply to an individual who is the subject of the hazing, regardless of whether the individual voluntarily allowed himself or herself to be hazed.
- (5) This section does not apply to an activity that is normal and customary in an athletic, physical education, military training, or similar program sanctioned by the educational institution.

- (6) It is not a defense to a prosecution for a crime under this section that the individual against whom the hazing was directed consented to or acquiesced in the hazing.
 - (7) As used in this section:
- (a) "Educational institution" means a public or private school that is a middle school, junior high school, high school, vocational school, college, or university located in this state.
- (b) "Hazing" means an intentional, knowing, or reckless act by a person acting alone or acting with others that is directed against an individual and that the person knew or should have known endangers the physical health or safety of the individual, and that is done for the purpose of pledging, being initiated into, affiliating with, participating in, holding office in, or maintaining membership in any organization. Subject to subsection (5), hazing includes any of the following that is done for such a purpose:
- (i) Physical brutality, such as whipping, beating, striking, branding, electronic shocking, placing of a harmful substance on the body, or similar activity.
- (ii) Physical activity, such as sleep deprivation, exposure to the elements, confinement in a small space, or calisthenics, that subjects the other person to an unreasonable risk of harm or that adversely affects the physical health or safety of the individual.
- (iii) Activity involving consumption of a food, liquid, alcoholic beverage, liquor, drug, or other substance that subjects the individual to an unreasonable risk of harm or that adversely affects the physical health or safety of the individual.
- (iv) Activity that induces, causes, or requires an individual to perform a duty or task that involves the commission of a crime or an act of hazing.
- (c) "Organization" means a fraternity, sorority, association, corporation, order, society, corps, cooperative, club, service group, social group, athletic team, or similar group whose members are primarily students at an educational institution.
- (d) "Pledge" means an individual who has been accepted by, is considering an offer of membership from, or is in the process of qualifying for membership in any organization.
- (e) "Pledging" means any action or activity related to becoming a member of an organization.
- (f) "Serious impairment of a body function" means that term as defined in section 479a.
- (8) This section shall be known and may be cited as "Garret's law". In addition to criminal sanctions, students found to have engaged in hazing will be held responsible under the guidelines and penalties set forth by the Siena Heights University Student Code of Conduct and are subject to disciplinary action to and including expulsion from the University.

Employees found to have engaged in hazing will be held responsible under the guidelines and penalties set forth by the Siena Heights University Employee

Handbook and are subject to disciplinary action to and including termination from the University.

HOW TO REPORT A HAZING INCIDENT

Any person should report a hazing concern, conduct or offense if they believe it has occurred or have reasonable cause to believe it will happen. Reasonable cause means a person who witnesses hazing or receives a credible written or oral report of hazing or potential or planned hazing activity.

If the incident is determined to violate Title IX, a separate investigation will be conducted from the Siena Heights Title IX office.


Siena Heights Dean of Students Office will handle all student code of conduct violations after a thorough investigation is completed.

These statistics are requested annually from the law enforcement agencies in the jurisdiction of the trip location.

STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

The freedom experienced by all members of the Siena Heights University community does not permit any member to interfere with the personal growth of others. To ensure that this environment is maintained, a conduct system for students has been established. This system is viewed by the university as the part of the educational experience which occurs when a student's conduct interferes with the University's responsibility for ensuring that all members of the community can attain their personal and professional goals. Employee discipline procedures and the student code of conduct system is outlined later in this document.

The conduct system is enacted when alleged infractions occur of the University's code of conduct, other policies, a crime or crimes are committed. Detailed lists of possible infractions are located in the student handbook and employee handbook. The University's actions are separate from criminal charges, prosecution or conviction. The goals and structure of the conduct system are outlined in the student handbook, including processes that allow both accused and accusor the same opportunities to have others present during University diciplinary proceeding.

All policy disclosures in this handbook are applicable to all students, and employees on all campuses of Siena Heights University.



SAFETY TIPS

RESIDENCE HALL SAFETY

- Make a habit of keeping your doors locked. Lock your room door when sleeping, when leaving a roommate asleep inside, and when leaving your room.
- Never prop open doors to residence halls.
- Report to the residence hall staff all doors, locks, and windows that are in need of repair.
- Be suspicious of unknown persons loitering or checking doors in your hall and call Public Safety to report them.
- Backpacks, purses, book bags, etc., should never be left unattended.
- Do not leave valuables in open view. Take valuables home during breaks.
- Door to door sales are not permitted in the residence halls at Siena Heights University. Do not open your door and contact Public Safety or an Resident Assistant to report solicitation activities immediately.

SAFETY TIPS

COMPUTER AND IDENTITY INFORMATION SAFETY

- Use a different robust password for all online accounts. Do not use your SHU ID# for anything else. Do not share your password with others or use another person's password.
- Never leave your laptop unattended. Lock your screen or log out before you
 walk away from a computer.
- Do not believe everything you read in e-mail. Never respond to an e-mail request for private information; no legitimate company will request information in this way.
- Keep records of your credit cards and bank numbers in a safe place. Shred
 confidential documents and CDs containing private personal information
 with a cross-cut shredder when no longer needed.
- If you receive a threatening e-mail, or post on a social networking site, contact
 the Department of Public Safety immediately, or post on a social networking

DRUG AND ALCOHOL POLICY

Siena Heights University complies with all federal, state, and local laws, including those, which regulate the possession, use and sale of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances. As an educational institution, Siena Heights University is committed to the development of a health environment, which stimulates intellectual and personal development in students as well as assuring their physical well-being. Inappropriate behavior concerning alcohol, to include underage drinking, is prohibited for students and employees. Complete details are available in the Student Code of Conduct and the Employee Handbook. The possession, consumption, sharing or sale of any controlled substance is prohibited. The student handbook and employee handbook details offenses and sanctions, including but not limited to online alcohol and drug abuse programs, probation, time without pay, suspensions, employment termination and student expulsion.

The Adrian Police Department may be called in for any suspicion of illegal drug use or possession on the Adrian Campus. The Siena Heights University Wellness Team offers referrals and assistance to students during mental health emergencies. The Wellness Team is located in the Health Services and Counseling Centers on the Adrian campus in Ledwidge Hall. Siena Heights University Human Resources offers referrals and assistance to employees in the form of an Employee Assistance Program. Educational programs, open for employees and students, addressing substance abuse and related issues are sponsored throughout the academic year on the Adrian Campus.

The Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989 required the adoption of an alcohol and drug policy and program by October 1, 1990. Under this policy/program, the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of alcohol or illicit drugs by employees or students on any Siena Heights University Campus or as a part of any University activity on or off University leased or owned property, may lead to sanctions/discipline with in the University; the severity of which shall increase as the seriousness of the violations increase.

Handling Alcohol Emergencies

Call Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety at 517.264.7800 or 911 if a person has passed out because of excessive alcohol use.

A potentially dangerous situation exists whenever an individual consumes too much alcohol. A high blood alcohol concentration level can result in bizarre, unpredictable behavior and/or unconsciousness. Too high of a blood alcohol concentration level can result in death. The degree of danger depends on the person's size, what and how much the person drank, during what time period, whether the person took drugs in addition to alcohol and other circumstances.

Get help immediately if...

- The person cannot be aroused by shaking or shouting.
- The person's breathing is shallow, irregular or slowed to less than seven breaths per minute.
- The person sustained a blow to the head or any injury that caused bleeding.
- The person drank a large quantity (e.g. a pint of liquor) or is disoriented, incoherent or has collapsed.

What to do

- Check regularly for breathing and consciousness.
- Roommates and friends should arrange to stay by the person's bed side.
 The person's position is important.
- Make sure the person is laying on their side, with knees bent.
- This position will deter choking should the person vomit.
- Warning: care should be taken in moving an unconscious victim who may have a back and/or neck injury.
- If the person vomits, stay with them to see that they do not swallow or breathe in the vomit.
- Get immediate help if the person has difficulty expelling the vomit or gags on it.

Sexual Misconduct, Dating Violence, Domestic Violence, Stalking, Sexual Harassment, and Other Acts of Sex and Gender Discrimination +

Siena Heights University Student Code of Conduct and the Employee Handbook prohibits sexually violent acts, termed "Sexual Misconduct" by the University, which can be crimes as well. Sexual misconduct includes non-consensual sexual intercourse, non-consensual sexual conduct, sexual exploitation, interpersonal/relationship violence, stalking, and sexual

harassment. While the University utilizes different standards (Preponderance of the evidence for both student and employee conduct+) and definitions than the State of Michigan Code, sexual misconduct often overlaps with the crimes of rape, sexual assault, sexual harassment, stalking, dating violence, and domestic violence. Victims of these behaviors are protected by federal laws, specifically Title IX, and the Clery Act, which mandates the contents of this report.

It is the policy of Siena Heights University to notify local law enforcement when sexual misconduct occurs that rises to the level of a violation of the State of Michigan Code (see definitions section in this document). *A victim has the right to decline reporting to law enforcement, unless an emergency requires disclosure. *Victims have the option to notify law enforcement directly, or to be assisted in doing so by campus authorities. *If requested, campus officials can facilitate reporting to local law enforcement.

In an effort to reduce the risk of sexual misconduct as well as the crimes of rape, sexual assault, sexual harassment, stalking, dating violence, and domestic violence occurring among the University community, the University utilizes a range of campaigns, strategies, and initiatives to promote awareness, education, risk reduction, and prevention programming.

It is the policy of Siena Heights University to offer programming to identify and prevent domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault (including stranger and known offender assaults), and stalking each year. Educational programs are offered to raise awareness for all incoming students and new employees, and are often conducting during new student and new employee orientation. Programs and other campaigns offered throughout the year to all students and employees include strong messages regarding not just awareness, but also primary prevention (including normative

messaging, environmental management, and bystander intervention), and discuss institutional policies on sexual misconduct as well as the State of Michigan definitions of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and consent in reference to sexual activity. Programs also offer information on risk reduction that strives to empower victims, how to recognize warning signals and how to avoid potential attacks, and do so without victim-blaming approaches. Examples include but are not limited to:

- Bystander intervention training programs,
- Sexual harassment on line module,
- Presentations,
- Guest speakers,
- Self-defense courses,
- Athletic teams and coaches trainings,
- Faculty/staff forums,
- Student leader trainings,
- Student senate presentations,
- Environmental management,
- Social media campaigns,
- Take back the night walk,
- Clothes line displays,
- Web pages,
- University employee on line portal page,
- Prominent window clings,
- April Sexual Assault Awareness month campaigns,
- Mandatory faculty/staff trainings,
- Public Safety trainings including but not limited to trauma based interviewing,
- Tip line,
- Campus Security Authority training—A complete listing is provided later in this document.

Programs are informed by evidence-based research and/or are assessed for their effectiveness.

Bystander engagement is encouraged through safe and positive intervention techniques and by empowering third-party intervention and prevention such as calling for help, using intervention-based apps, identifying allies, and/or creating distractions. Bystander empowerment training highlights the need for those who intervene to ensure their own safety in the intervention techniques they choose, and motivated them to intervene as stakeholders in the safety of the community when others might choose to be bystanders.

In the event that sexual misconduct, gender-based violence, or the crimes of sexual assault, stalking, dating violence or domestic violence do occur, the University takes the matter very seriously. The University employs interim protection measures such as interim suspensions and/or no contact orders in any case where a person's behavior represents a risk of violence, threat, pattern, or predation. If someone is accused of sexual misconduct, other gender-based violence, or the crimes of rape, sexual assault, sexual harassment, stalking, dating violence, or domestic violence, s/he is subject to action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct and/or the Employee Handbook. Anyone, including but not limited to students, faculty, staff, and guests, wishing to officially report such an incident may do so by contacting:

Anyone with knowledge about sexual misconduct, gender-based violence, or the crimes of rape, sexual assault, sexual harassment, stalking, dating violence, or domestic violence is encouraged to report it immediately. *Protective measures for victims are available from the campus whether a victim chooses to report to local and/or campus law enforcement, and irrespective of whether a victim pursues a formal complaint through the University resolution process.

*If you are the victim of sexual misconduct, gender-based violence, or the crimes of rape, acquaintance rape, sexual assault, sexual harassment, stalking, dating violence, or domestic violence, some or all of the safety suggestions may guide you after an incident has occurred:

- *Go to a safe place and speak with someone you trust. Tell this person what happened. If there is any immediate danger, contact Public Safety 517-264-7800 if you are on the Adrian campus or call 911 from other locations.
- *Consider securing immediate professional support (e.g., counseling, victim advocacy, medical services, etc. to assist you in the crisis.

Preserving Evidence*

- *For your safety and wellbeing, immediate medical attention is encouraged. Further, being examined as soon as possible, ideally within 120 hours, is important in the case of rape or sexual assault. The hospital will arrange for a specific medical examination at no charge or can work with you to arrange state reimbursement (see Forensic Medical Exam Payment at end of this section).
- *It is recommended that you do not bathe, shower, douche, eat, drink, smoke, brush your teeth, urinate, defecate, or change clothes before receiving medical attention. Even if you have already taken any of these actions, you are still encouraged to have prompt medical care, and evidence may still be recoverable.
- *Typically, if police are involved or will be involved, they will obtain evidence from the scene, and it is best to leave things undisturbed until their arrival. They may gather bedding, linens or unlaundered clothing, and any other pertinent articles that may be used for evidence. It is best to allow police to secure items in evidence containers, but if you are involved in transmission of items of evidence, such as to the hospital, secure them in a clean paper bag or clean sheet to avoid contamination.
- *If you have physical injuries, photograph or have them photographed, with a date stamp on the photo.
 - *Other considerations: record the names of any witnesses and their contact information. This information may be helpful as proof of a crime, to obtain an order of protection, or to offer proof of a campus policy violation.

 *Try to memorize details (e.g. physical description, names, license plate number, car description etc.) or even better, write notes to remind you of details, if you have time and the ability to do so.

Contact the Title IX Coordinator at 517-264-7109 or Public Safety at 517-264-7799 if you need assistance with University concerns, such as no-contact orders or other protective measures. The Title IX Coordinator or Public Safety will also assist if any needed advocacy for victims who wish to obtain protective or retraining orders from local authorities. The University is able to offer reasonable academic supports, changes to living arrangements, transportation resources or modifications, escorts, no contact orders, and other supports and resources as needed by a victim*. The University is able to offer information about legal assistance, visa/immigration assistance, and student financial aid considerations for victims*. Siena Heights University will provide written notification to victims, regardless of their initiation of or participation in criminal, University employment or student conduct systems, about available options and assistance in the following, including how to request these changes and who to contact at the institution:

- *Personal Protection Orders (PPO) are issued by courts. The Title IX Coordinator will assist with how to get the application, complete the application (including what documentation is needed), and how to file the application, if the application is granted by the presiding judge then the Title IX Coordinator will assist with how to legally (and safely) meet delivery obligations.
- *Bond Conditions are issued by court magistrates (and/or other court appointed) and are a legal protection measure issued after an arrest preceding

a release on bond, the Title IX Coordinator can assist with the process and/or assist victims to seek legal advocacy via the listed outside resources.

Legal Definitions

Siena Heights University prohibits sexual misconduct which definition is inclusive of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking and has published definitions of sexual misconduct. Clery reporting requirements utilize the federal UCR code for definitions. The State of Michigan has codes for Criminal Sexual Conduct. Below is a chart to assist with the overlapping of the various definitions. Full definitions are provided to the Siena Heights University for educational and awareness purposes.

Consent:

- State of Michigan—There is no legal definition of consent but there are four
 ways in which a person is unable to give consent with regards to criminal sexual
 conduct according to the Michigan Penal Code: The person is underage. Age
 of consent is 16. The person is intoxicated. The person has a developmental
 disability. The person was given a date rape drug.
- Clery—No definition of consent in the Clery law.
- Siena Heights University student and employee—Consent must be informed, freely given and mutual. If coercion, intimidation, threats, or physical force are used there is no consent. If a person is mentally or physically incapacitated or impaired so that such person cannot understand the fact, nature or extent of the sexual situation, there is no consent: this includes impairment or incapacitation due to alcohol or drug consumption or being asleep or unconscious. Inducement of incapacitation of another with the intent to affect the ability of an individual to consent or refuse to consent to sexual contact almost always, if not always, negates consent. Silence does not necessarily constitute consent. Whether a person has taken advantage of a position of influence over an alleged victim may be a factor in determining consent.

Dating Violence:

- State of Michigan—No definition of dating violence it is included in the domestic violence law.
- Clery—Violence committed by a person (1) who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim, and (2) the

existence of such a relationship shall be based on the reporting party's statement and with consideration of the length of the relationship, the type of the relationship, and the frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship. For the purposes of this definition dating violence includes, but is not limited to, sexual or physical abuse or the threat of such abuse. Dating violence does not include acts covered under the definition of domestic violence

Siena Heights University student and employees—Violence committed by
a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate
nature with the victim; and where the existence of such a relationship shall be
determined based on a consideration of the following factors: The length of the
relationship, the type of relationship, the frequency of interaction between the
persons involved in the relationship.

Domestic Violence:

- State of Michigan—Assault and assault and battery of his or her spouse or former spouse, an individual with whom he or she has had a child in common, a resident or formal resident of the same household, an individual with whom he or she has had a dating relationship, a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner, a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws, or any other person against an adult or youth victim show is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction
- Clery—Felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence committed: (i) by a current or former spouse or intimate partner of the victim; (ii) by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common; (iii) by a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner; (iv) by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction in which the crime of violence occurred; or (v) by any other person against an adult or youth victim who is protected from the person's actions under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction in which the crime of violence occurred.
- Siena Heights University students and employees—A pattern of abusive behavior
 that is used by an intimate partner to gain or maintain power and control over
 the other intimate partner. Domestic violence can be physical, sexual, emotional,
 economic, or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another
 person. This includes any behaviors that intimidate, manipulate, humiliate,
 isolate, frighten, terrorize, coerce, threaten, blame, hurt, injure, or wound
 someone.

• VAWA—Felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence (including threats or attempts) committed by a current or former spouse of the victim, by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, by a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse, by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies, or by any other person against an adult or youth victim/survivor who is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies. It should be understood that domestic violence/dating violence applies to any pattern of coercive behavior that is used by one person to gain power and control over a current or former intimate partner or dating partner. This pattern of behavior may include physical or sexual violence, emotional and psychological intimidation, threats, verbal abuse, stalking, isolation, and economic control. In compiling domestic violence figures, grantees should include grant funds directed at dating violence.

Economic Abuse:

- VAWA— The term 'economic abuse', in the context of domestic violence, dating
 violence, and abuse in later life, means behavior that is coercive, deceptive, or
 unreasonably controls or restrains a person's ability to acquire, use, or maintain
 economic resources to which they are entitled, including using coercion, fraud, or
 manipulation to:
 - 1. Restrict a person's access to money, assets, credit, or financial information;
 - 2. Unfairly use a person's personal economic resources, including money, assets, and credit, for one's own advantage; or
 - 3. Exert undue influence over a person's financial and economic behavior or decisions, including forcing default on joint or other financial obligations, exploiting powers of attorney, guardianship, or conservatorship, or failing or neglecting to act in the best interests of a person to whom one has a fiduciary duty (VAWA).

Sexual Assault:

State of Michigan—Sexual assault is any form of unwanted sexual contact
obtained without consent and/or obtained through the use of force, threat
of force, intimidation, or coercion. 1st degree (felony): a sexual act involving
penetration (broadly defined) and any of the following: Victim is under 13 years
old; victim is 13-15 years old+ is a blood affiliation to the defendant, lives in
the defendants household, or the defendant is in an authority opposition to the

victim; Multiple actors are involved and force/coercion was used to accomplish the sexual penetration or the victim is incapacitated (physically helpless, mentally incapacitated or mentally defective) weapon involved; personal injury + force/coercion; personal injury + victim incapacitated (unable to consent to due age, mental challenged or due to intoxication, date rape drug etc.) or defendant is in the process of committing another felony. 2nd degree (felony: sexual contact (no penetration) with the genital area, groin, inner thigh, buttock or breast, AND any of the circumstances listed for 1st degree CSC. 3rd degree sexual penetration and any of the following: victim is 13-15 years old, force or coercion or victim is incapacitated (unable to consent to due age, mental challenges, intoxication, date rape drug, etc.) 4th degree (misdemeanor) sexual contact and any of the following: force or coercion, victim incapacity (unable to consent due to age, mental challenges, intoxication, date rape drug, defendant works for the Department of Corrections and victim is an inmate.

- Clery—An offense that meets the definition of rape, fondling, incest, or statutory
 rape as used in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting system. A sex offense is any
 act directed against another people, without the consent of the victim, including
 instances where the victim if incapable of giving consent.
- Siena Heights University—Sexual misconduct Non-consensual sexual activity
 that occurs as a result of intimidation, threat of force, without active consent, or
 other coercive behavior on the part of accused, or taking advantage of the mental
 incapacitation or physical helplessness of the alleged victim. Examples of this
 include but are not limited to circumstances where consent is expressed but ruled
 invalid due to coercion; and/or circumstances where consent is expressed but
 ruled invalid due to incapacitation.

Stalking:

- State of Michigan—A willful course of conduct involving repeated or continuing
 harassment of another individual that would cause a reasonable person to feel
 terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, or molested and that
 actually causes the victim to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threated,
 harassed, or molested.
- Clery—Engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for the person's safety or the safety of others; or suffer substantial emotional distress. Including but not limited to willful course of conduct (a pattern of 2 or more separate acts) involving repeated or continuing harassment of another individual that would cause a reasonable person to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, fear for his or her safety or the safety of theirs, suffer substantial emotional distress or molested and that

actually caused the victim to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, fear for this or her safety of the safety of others, or suffer substantial emotional distress.

Siena Heights University students and employees—A pattern of repeated and
unwanted attention, contact, or any other course of conduct directed at a specific
person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for her, his, or others' safety,
or to suffer substantial emotional distress.

Technological Abuse:

 VAWA—An act or pattern of behavior that occurs within domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence or stalking and is intended to harm, threaten, intimidate, control, stalk, harass, impersonate, exploit, extort, or monitor, except as otherwise permitted by law, another person, that occurs using any form of information technology, including: internet enabled devices, online spaces and platforms, computers, mobile devices, cameras and imaging platforms, apps, location tracking devices, communication technologies, or any other emerging technologies.

Other Sexual Offenses

Other sexual offenses include the following: sodomy (forced anal intercourse); oral copulation (forced oral-genital contact); rape by a foreign object (forced penetration by a foreign object, including a finger); and sexual battery (the unwanted touching of an intimate part of another person for the purpose of sexual arousal).

Sexual Harassment

Sexual harassment is a form of misconduct that undermines the integrity of the academic environment. Is the policy of Siena Heights University that sexual harassment is prohibited. All members of the University community, especially officers, faculty, and other individuals who exercise supervisory authority, have an obligation to promote an environment that is free of sexual harassment.

Sexual Harassment: is defined as unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature that is unwanted, inappropriate, or without consent. Any and all types of sexual harassment are prohibited at the University.

Any complaints or inquiries regarding sexual harassment of a student, faculty member, or staff member should be brought to the immediate attention of the Title IX Coordinator 517-264-7109, or Human Resource Director 517-264-7109.

Any complaints or inquiries regarding sexual harassment of a student by another student should be brought to the immediate attention of the Title IX Coordinator 517-264-7109 or Public Safety 517-264-7800. The University will investigate such claims promptly and thoroughly. If, for any reason, a community member wishes to complain or inquire regarding sexual harassment, but feels it would not be appropriate to raise such issues with the positions named above, the community member may inquire or complain to the Dean for Students 517-264-7601 or the Academic Dean 517-264-7103, and such inquiries or complaints will receive a prompt and thorough investigation. If harassment is established, the University will discipline the offender. Disciplinary action for violations of this policy can range from verbal or written warnings, up to and including immediate termination from employment or dismissal from the University for serious or repeated violations.

Sex Offenders

In accordance to the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act of 2000, which amends the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Registration Act, the Jeanne Clery Act and Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, Siena Heights University is providing a link to the State of Michigan Sex Offender Registry. All sex offenders are required to register in the State of Michigan and to provide notice of each institution of higher education in Michigan at which the person is employed, carries out a vocation, or is a student: https://mspsor.com/.

In addition to the above notice to the State of Michigan, all sex offenders are required to deliver written notice of their status as a sex offender to the University Chief Public Safety Officer no later than three (3) business days prior to their enrollment in, employment with, volunteering at, or residence in the University. Such notification may be disseminated by the University to, and for the safety and well-being of, the University community, and may be considered by the University for enrollment and discipline purposes.

The University is committed to equal access to programs, facilities, admission and employment for all persons. It is the policy of the University to maintain an environment free of harassment and free of discrimination against any person because of age, race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, creed, service in the uniformed services (as defined in state and federal law), veteran status, sex, sexual orientation, marital or family status, pregnancy, pregnancy-related conditions, physical or mental disability, gender, perceived gender, gender identity, genetic information or political ideas. Discriminatory conduct, harassment, sexual misconduct, stalking, dating violence, domestic violence, and violation of the University's Employee Consensual Relationship policy violates the dignity of individuals, impedes the realization of the University's education mission, and will not be tolerated.

Compliance with this policy is a term and condition of employment and admission with the University. This policy applies to all students, administrators, faculty, staff, agents, contract employees, and individuals visiting or conducting business on University property. Conduct prohibited by this policy may also violate Title IX and Title VII, and other applicable federal and state laws.

Addressing Complaints

Siena Heights University has a duty to respond to all allegations of discrimination (including sexual harassment) and, therefore, cannot guarantee absolute confidentiality once allegations are disclosed to university officials. The confidentiality of information disclosed during the course of investigations or informal resolution efforts will be respected to the extent feasible and practical. This means that information about the complaint is shared only with those individuals within the University community who "need to know" in order to effectively investigate and/or resolve the complaint. Parties with a need to know may include witnesses or university officials who need to be informed of the complaint in order to cooperate with an investigation or to implement resolution. These parties will be advised that she should keep the information confidential in the best interests of all parties.

Prompt and equitable corrective measures will be taken to stop discrimination or harassment, to remedy the effects of the discrimination or harassment, and to prevent future instances of discrimination and harassment. When appropriate, upon receipt of notice, the Title IX Coordinator will cause a prompt, fair, and impartial process to be initiated, commencing with an investigation, which may lead to the imposition of sanctions (students) or disciplines (employees) based upon a Preponderance of the Evidence (more likely than not).

For offenses including sexual misconduct or other gender based violence, which typically include the crimes of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual harassment, sexual misconduct, and stalking, sanctions range from warning to expulsion or termination. Serious and violent incidents and acts of non-consensual sexual intercourse (the policy equivalent to the crime of rape) usually result in suspension, expulsion, or termination of employment. Lying to investigators (and/or failing to participate in an investigation) can result in additional consequences under the Student Code of Conduct and the Employee Handbook.

Disciplinary sanctions for student violations of this policy will be imposed in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct. Disciplinary sanctions for employee violations of this policy will be imposed in accordance with the Employee Handbook. Possible student sanctions and/or employment discipline include, but not limited to, the following:

- Revocation of admission and/or degree
- Termination of employment
- Expulsion
- Suspension
- Deferred suspension
- Disciplinary probation
- Time off without pay
- Time off with pay
- Loss of promotion or promotional status
- No trespass order
- Restrictions/loss of privileges
- Discretionary sanctions
- Employment counseling
- Written warning
- Verbal warning

Procedurally, the University receives a report of sexual misconduct, gender-based violence, or other sex or gender discrimination, the campus Title IX Coordinator is notified. If the victim wishes to access local community agencies and/or law enforcement for support, the University will assist the victim in making these contacts*. The Title IX Coordinator will offer assistance to victims in the form of interim or long-term measures such as opportunities for academic or work accommodations; changes in housing for the victim or the responding if students, visa and immigration assistance, changes in working situations, and other assistance as may be appropriate and available on campus or in the community*. If the victim so desires, that individual will be connected with a counselor on-or off-campus, as well as a victim advocate*. No victim is required to take advantage of these services and resources, but the University provides them in the hopes of offering help and support without condition or qualification*. A summary of rights, options, supports, and procedures is provided to all victims, whether they are students, employees, guests, or visitors*.

All internal investigations will be handled by the Chief Public Safety Officer, the Title IX Coordinator and/or the Associate Vice President for Human Resources. If a complaint regarding harassment or discrimination is lodged against any individual in the offices of human resources or public safety an external investigation process may be utilized. For internal investigations, the Office of Public Safety, Title IX, and Human Resources shall follow the following process.

- 1. Listen to the complaint and assist the complainant in clarifying their experiences and feelings.
- 2. Determine the complaint's desired resolution expectations and wishes.

- 3. Establish and implement a safety plan with the complainant to ensure safety of all parties involved. The respondent(s) may be immediately removed from the Siena Heights community if, in the opinion of the Office of human Resources of the Office of Public Safety, or the appropriate member of the Executive Committee of the Administration that the safety of the University, the students, or employees is jeopardized by the respondent's continued presence. In the case of employees, this may result in a suspension with or without pay at the University's discretion. Respondents who are the subject of corresponding criminal charges may likewise be suspended pending a resolution of those charges by the court.
- Advise the complainant on his/her options and legal rights/resources and explanation of the University's investigation process, in writing when possible.
- Receive from the complainant written consent to speak with the respondent and witnesses that may have direct knowledge of the situation or occurrences when possible.
- 6. Interview the respondent witnesses without revealing the identity of the complainant to the extent possible and determine if any violation of University policies or state and federal laws have occurred. If it has become evident that a criminal act has occurred, the University will report all findings to the appropriate legal authorities.
- Provide a written report of the investigation and recommendations to the appropriate member of the Executive Committee of the Administration (employee), or Student Conduct Administrator.
- 8. Receive from the complaint (and respondent when appropriate) a written acknowledgment of understanding of the findings of the investigation.
- Preponderance of the evidence (more likely than not) standard will be applied
 to the decision making process for both student and employee cases, student
 cases will be adjudicated in the student conduct process and employees will be
 determined within the employee handbook process.
- 10. Once a decision is made both the respondent and the complainant will receive written notification of the results (simultaneously without delay).
 - a. Upon request the University will disclose the results of any disciplinary proceeding conducted by the University against a student who is the alleged perpetrator of any crime of violence or a non-forcible sex offense to the alleged victim, or the next of kin if the victim is deceased.
- 11. Appeals are available for employees and students, both respondents and

complainants, notification in writing and simultaneously without delay.

12. Should any change in outcome occur prior to finalization, all parties will be timely informed in writing, and will be notified when the results of the resolution process become final.

The investigation and records of the resolution conducted by the University for both students and employees are maintained confidentially. Information is shared internally between administrators who need to know, but a tight circle is kept. Investigative decisions on who is a need to know is determined by the Title IX office and/or the Human Resource office. Where information must be shared to permit the investigation to move forward, the person bringing the accusation will be informed. Privacy of the records specific to the investigation is maintained in accordance with the State of Michigan and federal FERPA statute. Any publicly available record keeping, including Clery Act reporting and disclosures, will be maintained with the inclusion of the personally identifying information about the victim. Additionally, the University maintains privacy in relation to any accommodations or protective measures afforded to a victim, except to the extent necessary to provide the accommodations and/or protective measures. Typically, if faculty members, supervisors or administrators are asked to provide accommodations for a specific individual, they are told that such accommodations are necessary under Title IC or the Clery Act, but they are not given any details of the incident, or what kind of incident it is. Irrespective of state law or public records access provisions, information about victims is maintained privately in accordance with Title IX and Ferpa.

Both Title IX and the Clery Act provide protections for whistleblowers who bring allegations of no-compliance with the Clery Act and/or Title IX to the attention of appropriate campus administrators. The University does not retaliate against those who raise concerns of non-compliance. Any concerns should be brought to the immediate attention of the campus Title IX Coordinator and/or to officials of the U.S. Department of Education.

FORENSIC MEDICAL EXAM PAYMENT

Under a provision of the VAWA reauthorization act of 2005 (u.S.C.A. 3796gg), states must ensure that victims of sexual assault have access to a forensic medical exam, free of charge or with full reimbursement, even if the victim chooses not to report the crime to the police or otherwise participate with law enforcement authorities or the criminal justice system.

To be eligible for vawa S.T.O.P. Formula grant funds, all states must be able to certify that they are in compliance with the statutory eligibility requirements within vawa on or before january 5, 2009. Information about this 2005 statute and additional up-to-date information is available at: www.Mcasa.Org.

Considering moving off campus?

- How safe will your commute be to campus?
- Does the facility have security on site?
- Is an intercom system used or are peep holes installed in doors?

- Keep yard mowed and keep exterior clean and neat
- Talk with your neighbors, especially prior to having friends over discuss appropriate noise volumes and times, also discuss parking of guests

RESTRICTIONS ON WEAPONS/DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES

Possession and/or use of firearms, knives over 3 inches, ammunition, fireworks, gasoline, and other combustible or explosive items (including non-lethal projectile type weapons such as air soft, "bb", paint ball etc.) or the brandishing of any objects in a threatening manner on University premises are not permitted. Local and/or Federal authorities will contacted.

SAFETY TIPS

SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

All students, faculty, and staff are encouraged to promptly and accurately report all suspicious activity to the Department of Public Safety and/or other appropriate authority. Since safety is everyone's responsibility, it is important for people to be aware of type of behavior and actions which may signal criminal activities. In the University setting these may include:

- A person who seems to be wandering in the hallways or lurking about the building.
 - Any unusual or suspicious noise that you can't explain, such as glass breaking.
 - Vehicle moving slowly without lights or to no apparent destination.
 - A person hanging around windows or parking lots.
 - A person removing property from a building late at night.

VEHICLE SAFETY

- Have your keys in hand before you reach your parked vehicle.
- Check the area surrounding your vehicle.
- Check the interior of your vehicle before entering it.
- If you have vehicle problems in a questionable area, drive on until you reach a safe, well-lit area.
- Make a habit of keeping car doors locked.
- Park in a well lit area preferably someplace highly visible with plenty of activity.



UNIVERSITY SMOKING POLICY

PURPOSE:

Siena Heights University recognizes the negative risks associated with the use of tobacco and other smoking related products and became a tobacco free campus July 1, 2011.

This policy only applies to buildings and grounds on the Adrian Campus of Siena Heights University.

POLICY:

Usage of tobacco and other smoking related products shall be prohibited on University grounds and in University vehicles. Additionally, the advertisement of smoke related products shall be strictly prohibited.

Employees that are assigned to work at locations other than the University's Adrian Campus must follow the rules and regulations of the host site.

Siena Heights University appreciates the cooperation of all smokers to abide by the University's Smoking Policy. The Public Safety Department will enforce this policy and repeated violations can result in progressive disciplinary action. Cessation program information will be available through the University Health Center and the Human Resource Department.

PROTECTING YOUR ELECTRONIC DEVICES

With the portability of electronic devices, loss can happen quickly and easily. Laptops and PDAs, along with most video game systems are easy to carry and conceal. The following tips will help to protect your valuable electronic equipment:

- Keep receipts and other pertinent records in a separate location from the electronic devices.
- Keep your doors locked and do not let strangers into your residence hall room or apartment
- Report suspicious situations to the Department of Public Safety immediately.
- Do not prop open exterior doors.
- Be aware of who knows about your electronic devices.

What if my electronic device is stolen?:

Call the Department of Public Safety at 517.264.7800 or '0' from a SHU phone.

- Report that your electronic device was stolen.
- A Public Safety Officer will contact you to complete an incident report.
- The Public Safety Officer will ask if you want a police report along with the Public Safety report. Most insurance companies will accept the Department of Public Safety's report.
- Get an incident report number from the Public Safety Officer.
- Contact the Director of Public Safety at 517.264.7723 for a copy of the report.
 Reports are generally available within 48 hours.
- Contact your insurance company.

Insurance Information:

Siena Heights University is not responsible for the loss of any personal items. Individuals are encouraged to purchase personal insurance. Most insurance companies offer inexpensive coverage for both on- and off-campus living.

Siena Heights works with local law enforcement to assist with receiving timely information concerning potential threats to the safety of the campus community. Siena Heights University works with host campus security and/or public safety departments to assist with receiving timely information concerning potential threats to the safety of the degree completion centers.

Timely Warning

Scope: Narrow focus on Clery Act Crimes

Why: Timely warnings are triggered by crimes that have already occurred but represent an ongoing threat. Timely warnings are issued for any Clery Act Crime committed on the campus Clery Act geography that is reported to campus security authorities or a local law enforcement agency. Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety is responsible for issuing timely warnings that are determined (by Public Safety and/or Law Enforcement) to be considered to represent a serious or continuing threat to students and employees on any of the University campuses.

Where: Applies to crimes that occur on any of the Siena Heights University clery defined on campus. Or in a reasonably contiguous geographic area that could impact the employees and students of Siena Heights University.

<u>When:</u> Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety will issue a warning as soon as there is a confirmed immediate or on-going threat to the health or safety of students and employees occurring on any of the University campuses.

Siena Heights University Public Safety will, without delay, and taking into account the safety of the community, determine the content of the notification and initiate the notification system, unless issuing the notification will, in the professional judgement of responsible authorities, compromise efforts to assist a victim or to contain, respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency.

Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety is responsible for issuing Timely Warnings.

Process for timely warning notifications during a threat to the health or safety of students or employees on campus:

- An assessment of the threat will be conducted by emergency response authorities
- The community protocol will be determined by the content of the threat and finalized by the Department of Public Safety
- Initiation of the communication will be done by one of the following:
 - o Chief of Public Safety
 - o Deputy Director of Public Safety
 - o Emergency Manager
 - o Communications Director
 - Assistant Communications Director
 - o Highest ranking Public Safety Command

Campus Security Authority (CSA)

"Campus Security Authority" is a *Clery* Act specific term that encompasses four groups of individuals and organizations associated with an institution. At Siena Heights University CSA's are identified by the Department of Public Safety and given annual notification and responsibilities.

The function of a CSA is to report to the Department of Public Safety crime report information for allegations of *Clery* Act crimes that they receive. CSAs are responsible for reporting allegations of *Clery* Act crimes that are reported to them in their capacity as a CSA. This means that CSAs are not responsible for reporting incidents that they overhear talking about in a third party conversation; or any other indirect manner. CSAs are not expected to investigation any *Clery* Act crime.

Any official of an institution who has significant responsibly for student and campus activities, including, but not limited to, student housing, student discipline and campus judicial proceedings	Athletic staff, Athletic trainers, Athletic Director, Athletic coaches, Student Organization Advisors and Officers, Director of Health Center, Title IX Coordinator and Advisory Board, Student Development Staff, Faculty Advisors, Resident Advisors, Campus Living Assistants, Conduct Officers, CARE team Members, Retention Officers, SSS Staff and Mentors (this list is not intended to be all inclusive and might change as job descriptions and personnel change)

There is a distinction between CSA and Title IX responsible employees. All Siena Heights University employees are mandatory (responsible) reporters under the Title IX provisions. CSA are select employees as determined by the Department of Public Safety. The University Counseling center is a confidential reporter under Title IX and a CSA under the *Clery* Act, counselors working within the scope of the University Counseling center are only required to report statistics for *Clery* Act crimes.*

Emergency Notifications Policy:

<u>Emergency Notification:</u> communication issuance in the case of an immediate threat to the health or safety of students or employees occurring on campus.

If there is a confirmed immediate threat to the health or safety of students or employees occurring on campus SHU Alerts will be the first form of emergency notifications; in most circumstances.

Siena Heights works with local law enforcement to assist with receiving timely information concerning potential threats to the safety of the campus community.

Emergency Notification

Scope: Wide focus on any significant emergency or dangerous situation (may include Clery Act crimes).

Why: Emergency notification is triggered by an event that is currently occurring on or imminently threatening the campus. Initiate emergency notification procedures for any significant emergency or dangerous situation occurring on the campus involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of students or employees.

Where: Applies to situations that occur on your campus.

<u>When:</u> Initiate procedures immediately upon confirmation that a dangerous situation or emergency exists or threatens.

Siena Heights University will, without delay, and taking into account the safety of the community, determine the content of the notification and initiate the notification system, unless issuing the notification will, in the professional judgment of responsible authorities, compromise efforts to assist a victim or to contain, respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency.

Process for notifications during a threat to the health or safety of students or employees on campus:

- Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety is alerted to an emergency situation, notification could come from, but not limited to: police scanner, CSA, community member, tip line, neighbors, switchboard, hotline, email, voicemail, host campus safety or security, or Adrian campus Public Safety patrol officer observations
- Emergency response authorities will conduct an assessment of the threat. Siena
 Heights University Department of Public safety will verify if there is a legitimate
 emergency or dangerous situation that may threaten the safety of any Siena Heights
 University Campus
- Once verified, then the decision for which appropriate segment(s) of the campus
 community will be determined by the specifics of the situation. i.e. An immediate
 threat to the health or safety on the Lansing Campus the emergency notification
 will be issued by Siena Heights University Public Safety and/or authorized campus
 authorities (see list below) for the Lansing Campus only
- The communication protocol will determine the content of the notification. For
 most types of emergencies the University mass notification system has pre-scripted
 mass notification messages (predetermined by the university crisis response team
 coordinator), this is to ensure that the emergency notification can be issued out to
 the community without delay. Large events with public broadcast systems are given
 pre-scripted emergency plans and notifications developed for the specific event by
 Siena Heights University Public Safety
- The following University employees have the authority to issue University Emergency Notifications:
 - o Chief of Public Safety
 - o Deputy Director of Public Safety
 - Emergency Manager
 - o Communications Director
 - o Assistant Communications Director
 - o Highest ranking Public Safety Command
- Siena Heights University has a crisis response team and a CARE team (behavior
 intervention team). Different professionals are called upon for their expertise
 depending upon the type of emergency. Examples of offices or individuals involved
 in other decisions or actions include but not limited to:
 - o University President Office
 - o University Information Systems Office
 - o Local Police Departments

- o County Emergency Managements
- o County Sheriff Departments
- o Michigan State Police
- o Local Fire and Rescue
- University Maintenance and Custodial services (host campus if not on the Adrian campus)
- o Adrian campus only Residence Life office
- University business manager
- o University communications office
- o University public safety or host campus public safety/security
- o Local hospitals

Siena Heights University mass notification system (SHU Alerts) is available to the larger community, including parents, neighbors, etc.

SHU ALERTS Mass Notification System

Siena Heights University introduces a state-of-the-art notification system which instantly sends emergency messages to faculty, staff, students, parents and alumni. Once registered for SHU Alerts, users will receive alerts via mobile phones (via SMS text message), University and/or personal e-mail accounts, and/or the University web page. Implementation of the SHU Alert system will allow the University to quickly and efficiently contact every registered member of the University in the event of an emergency, crisis situation, school closing or other events requiring emergency notifications. SHU Alerts are available for all of the Siena Heights University campuses located throughout Michigan.

Siena Heights University will conduct annual scheduled drills, exercises, and appropriate follow-through activities, designed for assessment and evaluation of emergency plans and capabilities. These tests will assist with evaluating procedures for emergency response evacuation and notification systems annually. In conjunction with the annual tests, emergency and evactuation procedures will be published. These tests might be announced ahead of time or they might be unannounced. Tests are documented and kept for seven years in the Department of Public Safety. The documentation includes the description, date, and times of the tests.

Siena Heights University strongly encourages faculty, staff, students, parents and alumni to register – it only takes a minute. Users sign up for this service at no cost to the user unless their wireless service agreement charges for receiving text messages. SAFETY TIPS

OUTDOOR SAFETY

- Walk on designated walkways that are well lit and well traveled.

- If you are followed by a vehicle, turn around and go the opposite way.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE & EVACUATION SIENA HEIGHTS UNIVERSITY —ADRIAN CAMPUS

Emergencies, disasters, accidents, injuries, and crimes can occur without warning at any time.

The University Emergency Guidelines have been developed to assist in minimizing the negative effects from such events. EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Siena Heights University Public Safety (SHU DPS) Officers have received training in Incident Command and Responding to Critical Incidents on campus. When a serious incident occurs that causes an immediate threat to the campus, the first responders to the scene are usually SHU DPS, Adrian Police Department, and the Adrian Fire Department, and they typically respond and work together to manage the incident. Depending on the nature of the incident, other SHU departments and other local or federal agencies could also be involved in responding to the incident.

General information about the emergency response and evacuation procedures for SHU are publicized each year as part of the Institution's Clery Act compliance efforts and that information is available on the SHU web site. Detailed information about and updates to the SHU crisis response manual are available via SHU crisis response coordinator.

Members of the University community are expected to notify the SHU DPS of any situation or incident on campus that involves a significant emergency or dangerous situation that may involve an immediate or ongoing threat to the health and safety of students and/or employees on campus. SHU DPS has the responsibility of responding to, and summoning the necessary resources, to mitigate, investigate, and document any situation that may cause a significant emergency or dangerous situation. In addition, SHU DPS has a responsibility to respond to such incidents to determine if the situation does in fact, pose a threat to the community. If that is the case, Federal Law requires that the institution immediately notify the campus community or the appropriate segments of the community that may be affected by the situation.

ACTIVE SHOOTER

In the event of an active shooter:

- IF IT IS SAFE TO DO SO: RUN, evacuate the area, leave belongings, warn others, keep your hands visible, follow instructions from emergency responders, call 911/Public Safety when safe to do so.
- IF IT IS UNSAFE TO EVACUATE: HIDE, secure the room you are in, lock doors if you can, barricade the door with whatever you can, if you are in a hall get into a room, be out of sight, be quiet, remain calm, hide behind large heavy objects that may offer protection, call 911/Public Safety when safe to do so, follow instructions from emergency responders, do not unsecure the area until instructed to do so by law enforcement.
- AS A LAST RESORT: FIGHT, only when your life is in imminent danger, attempt to disrupt and/or incapacitate the shooter, act quickly and aggressively, throw objects or improvise weapons, be loud and assertive, commit to your actions, a temporary disruption may provide a chance to run.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE & EVACUATION CONT. SIENA HEIGHTS UNIVERSITY —ADRIAN CAMPUS

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROTOCOL Established 6/02

GENERAL EVACUATION INFORMATION

Situations requiring evacuation could include but are not limited to the following:

- Natural gas leak
- Flammable liquid spill/and or release
- Bomb threat
- Power line failure
- Hostage situation
- Hazardous chemical spill/and or release
- Flooding
- Fire alarm

BUILDING EVACUATION

- All building evacuations will occur when a SHU Alert is issued to evacuate and/or an alarm sounds and/or upon notification by Siena Heights University Public Safety, Police Officer, or Fire Department personnel.
- When the building evacuation alarm is activated during an emergency, leave
 by the nearest marked exit and alert others to do the same. Remember that
 elevators should never be used during an emergency evacuation situation.
- Assist persons with disabilities in exiting the building. Two or three individuals
 may carry the persons with disabilities from the building if the persons with
 disabilities cannot negotiate the stairs.
- If persons with disabilities cannot be transported from the building without using an elevator assist person with disabilities to a safe area, notify emergency personnel immediately.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE & EVACUATION CONT.

- Once outside, proceed to the designated gathering point. This should be a clear
 area that is at least 500 feet or further, depending on the type of incident, away
 from the affected building. Stay there. This designated area should be predetermined by an office manager, supervisor, or RA.
- Keep streets, fire lanes, hydrant areas, and walkways clear for emergency vehicles and personnel. Know your area assembly points.
- Immediately notify emergency personnel of any injured persons and individuals remaining, in the affected building.

Do not return to an evacuated building unless told to do so by emergency personnel, building or university officials.

ALL CAMPUS EVACUATION

- Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety and/or other response personnel will announce evacuation of all or part of the campus grounds.
- All persons (student and staff) are to vacate the site in question immediately and relocate to another part of the campus grounds as directed.
- Follow the building evacuation procedures described above for individual building and affected sites.

In most circumstances, SHU Alerts is the first form of communication when there is a confirmed immediate threat to the health or safety of students or employees occurring on campus.

EMERGENCY REVERSE EVACUATION PROTOCOL Established 5/04

GENERAL REVERSE EVACUATION INFORMATION

Situations requiring reverse evacuation could include but are not limited to the following:

- Tornadoes
- Winter Storms
- Severe Weather



ALL CAMPUS REVERSE EVACUATION

TORNADO

- 1] In the event an actual tornado has been sighted in the area (tornado warning), SHU Alerts will be issued and the siren above Weber center will activate along with the city sirens. These sirens are activated by the Lenawee County Sheriff's Department, will sound a steady blast for 3 minutes. Campus Public Safety will be alerted via the S.A.M.E. (Specific Area Message Encoding) weather radio system.
- 2] All persons in campus buildings should go to the lowest level possible within the building. Enter an interior room or hallway with no windows. Stay away from windows. The best avaliable shelter areas are posted near exits in every building on the Adrian Campus.
- 3] Assist others in your immediate area to exit to the nearest available shelter area.
- 4] Persons should remain in a place of shelter until the all clear signal is sounded. The all-clear signal will be noted by a SHU Alert and a steady siren blast from the Motherhouse siren and city sirens lasting 90 seconds.
- 5] After the all clear is sounded, assess damage and/or injuries. If there is significant life threatening damage, i.e. downed lines, fires, ruptured gas lines, etc. or injury, call 9-911 or Public Safety at ext. 7800 if using campus phoneline.

SEVERE WEATHER CONT.

SEVERE WEATHER DEFINITIONS

<u>TORNADO WATCH:</u> Tornadoes are possible in your area. Remain alert for approaching storms. Listen to your local radio/television outlets; if on the Adrian campus contact Public Safety at "0" for a S.A.M.E. weather radio update.

<u>SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH:</u> Severe thunderstorms are possible in your area, watch the sky and listen to your local radio/television outlets. If you are at the Adrian campus contact Public Safety at "0" for a S.A.M.E. weather radio update.

TORNADO WARNING: A tornado has been sighted or indicated by weather radar.

IF A TORNADO IS SIGHTED, OR INDICATED BY RADAR, IN THE VICINITY OF THE ADRIAN CAMPUS, PUBLIC SAFETY WILL ISSUE A SHU ALERT AND THE SIREN ON THE MOTHERHOUSE WILL SOUND. IMMEDIATELY RELOCATE TO THE NEAREST SAFE ZONE, REMAIN THERE UNTIL RELEASED BY PUBLIC SAFETY.

<u>SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING:</u> Issued when severe weather has been reported by spotters or indicated by radar. Warnings indicate imminent danger to life and property to those in the path of the storm.

FOR MORE SEVERE WEATHER INFORMATION: www.nws.noaa.gov

Occasionally, tornadoes develop so rapidly that advance warning is not possible. Remain alert for signs of an approaching tornado such as a dark, often greenish sky, large hail, or a loud roar similar to a freight train.

Procedures for Siena Heights University Community Members in Case of Fire:

- Sign up for SHU Alerts, in most cases this will be the first notification sent
- Always exit when a fire alarm is activated
- Learn the location of fire exits and alarm boxes near you and know the emergency number for assistance (517.264.7800 or 911)
- Sound the fire alarm if you see smoke or detect a burning odor
- Have a prepared escape plan and know at least two escape routes
- Remember to remain calm
- Use exit stairs. Never use elevators
- Assist disabled, if unable to leave in a safe location and notify emergency response of their location
- Feel a door with the back of your hand before opening it by the handle
- Close doors behind you as you escape. In most cases, this will prevent smoke damage and
 fire from entering the room you are exiting
- Do not re-enter a fire damaged building until it has been declared safe. If you become trapped, seal off cracks around doors and vents with cloth or rugs (soaked in water if possible). Shut off fans and air conditioners. Signal for help from a window. Contact Public Safety at 517.264.7800 or 911. Remain calm. Rescue may only be moments away.

FIRE SAFETY REPORT/RESIDENCE HALLS CONT.

False Alarm

Activating a fire alarm while knowing that there is not a fire is a crime. The guilty party can receive up to one year in jail and/or a fine of up to \$500. False fire alarms waste time, money and most importantly can cost human lives.

Future Fire Safety Plans

Improvements in fire safety equipment and plans is an ongoing process for Siena Heights University. The safety of the Siena community is a priority in the University master plan. At the time of this Annual Fire Safety Report there are no future plans for specific fire safety improvement.

SAFETY TIPS

FIRE SAFETY

Your worst enemy during a fire is smoke. If you are caught in smoke, get down on the floor and crawl to safety. Close doors behind you as you escape, and use stairs, NEVER, elevators. Simple fire safety tips to follow are:

- Make sure there is a working smoke detector near your sleeping quarters.
- Learn the location of fire exits and alarm boxes near you.
- Sound the fire alarm if you see smoke or fire.
- Do not re-enter a building until it has been declared safe for re-entry.
- Report fire safety violations to Public Safety.
- Attend RA/CLA hall meetings and orientation sessions to learn evacuation procedures, routes and fire safety guidelines specific to your building(s).

FIRE SAFETY REPORT/RESIDENCE HALLS CONT.

Residence Hall Fire Safety Regulations Saints Guide & Student Code of Conduct:

Appliances and Electronics

Residents may use the following appliances in their rooms: clocks, radios, stereos, televisions, fans, hair dryers, curling irons, razors, computers, popcorn poppers, coffeepots, microwaves, and refrigerators. As a general guideline, most approved items have an approved UL labels. Specifically, heating units, large refrigerators, humidifiers, toasters, toaster ovens, electric skillets/fryers, and hot plates are considered hazardous for use and are consequently not permitted in the residence halls. If unsure about a specific electrical item, contact the Office of Residence Life to determine if the appliance is permissible.

Residence Life reserves the right to remove any electrical violation not meeting the established fire and safety codes. Candles and other open flame items are prohibited.

Smoking is prohibited in any building owned by Siena Heights University.

Siena Heights University's Department of Public Safety is committed to the prevention of crime and is proactive in its efforts to prevent any potential problems. Crime prevention information is circulated in a number of different ways throughout the academic year.

The Department of Public Safety urges all community members to actively help maintain a safe work and learning environment. Informing Public Safety Officers of any violations either of University policy or of criminal conduct is crucial in helping to keep our community as safe as possible.

Public Safety is committed to investigating all reported offenses. Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety maintains a close, cooperative relationship with the Adrian Police Department, and provides information of potentially threatening crime-related activity within the immediate area of the University to encourage the campus community to be responsible for their security and that of others.



SAFETY TIPS

VEHICLE SAFETY

- Have your keys in hand before you reach your parked vehicle.
- Check the area surrounding your vehicle.
- Check the interior of your vehicle before entering it.
- If you have vehicle problems in a questionable area, drive on until you reach a safe, well-lit area.
- Make a habit of keeping car doors locked.
- Park in a well lit area preferably someplace highly visible with plenty of activity.

RESIDENCE HALL SAFETY

Although the residence halls are generally a very safe environment, they are not without crime. The majority of crimes in the residence halls involve the theft of personal property. Few of these thefts involve forced entry, and most offenses fall into the category of "crimes of opportunity." Effective security and protection of people and property are the primary responsibilities of all members of the campus community. We encourage students to be security conscious at all times.

SAFETY TIPS

RESIDENCE HALL SAFETY

- 1. Do not prop open locked residence hall doors.
- 2. Lock your door when sleeping.
- 3. Lock your room when leaving a roommate asleep inside.
- Lock your door when you leave, regardless of the length of time you plan to be gone.
- 5. Keep small items of value, such as wallets, money and jewelry, out of sight; preferably in a small safe.
- Take advantage of the free engraving and registration of electronic devices with the Department of Public Safety.
- Mark all clothing with a laundry pen or needle and thread, in a place other than the label.
- 8. Do not leave notes on your door announcing that no one is in.
- 9. Do not take in overnight guests whom you do not know.

- Do not allow door-to-door salespeople to enter your room. University policy prohibits soliciting and the alleged salesperson may be "casing" your room for later theft.
- 11. Never lend out your room key.
- 12. Report all thefts immediately to Public Safety, 517.264.7800.
- Report to the residence hall staff all doors, locks and windows that are in need of repair.
- 14. Be suspicious of unknown persons loitering or checking doors in your hall. Note their descriptions and call Public Safety immediately.
- Do not invite people you "meet" on the internet to your room, or to stay overnight in your room.
- 16. Properly check in all guests with Public Safety.

Policy Regarding the Use and Possession of Hover Boards and Similar Devices (1/07/16)

Recent information has revealed that the batteries in the devices are dangerous and prone to explosion, creating a safety and fire risk. Until a time that the safety standards of these devices are improved, Siena Heights University Public Safety has prohibited them from being on the Adrian campus, including storage in any University housing. Effective immediately, the use, possession, or storage of Hoverboards, Swagways, IO Hawks, Skywalkers, and similar devises, is prohibited on campus until safety standards for them can be developed and implemented, and the prohibition lifted.

If you have one of these devices please remove it from campus. If you received or purchased one of these devices while off campus you will not be able to have it on campus and if it is found it will be confiscated. Violation of this policy will result in referral to student conduct and/or human resources and removal of the device.

The Flight of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Require University Approval

Siena Heights University requires that anyone bringing an Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) or "drone" to any of the university campuses, must register use and get permission for use from the Risk Management Department. This is designed to ensure the safety of the campus community in addition to protecting the privacy of others. UAS operators must also comply with applicable federal, state, and local laws.

All operation and use of unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) and model aircraft on or above university property must comply with federal aviation administration (FAA) regulations, and any local, state and federal laws. Any operation or use violating such regulations and laws is prohibited. It is the responsibility of the operator to ensure compliance with all applicable laws. (E) Enforcement and penalties (1) Any person operating a UAS or model aircraft on university property without University Risk Management approved; in violation of their FAA approved status or any federal, state or local law; or, in violation of university policies, may be advised by University Public Safety or any university representative with control or jurisdiction over the activity to cease operation immediately until appropriate approval is received. (2) Student violations maybe addressed in accordance with the code of student conduct, as well as other applicable policies and may include sanctions, up to and including expulsion. (3) Employee violations may be resolved in accordance with university disciplinary policies, up to and including termination. (4) Any violators of local, state and federal laws and regulations may be addressed by appropriate law enforcement or FAA authorities.

CRIME PREVENTION CONT.—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Siena Heights University Public Safety Department is committed to providing you with respectful and professional service. While we can promise you a committed effort to ensure your safety, we are of course unable to promise total isolation from crime. Therefore, it is important that each of you takes responsibility for your own safety. The key to preventing crime is awareness which is best achieved through education.

FACILITY ACCESS (Adrian Campus)

In the interest of security, access to campus facilities is somewhat restricted. The restrictions are based on the academic year. Specific details and time can be obtained from Public Safety 517.264.7800. Buildings, grounds, and parking lots are well lit. Trees and shrubs on the developed portion of the campus do not cause a security concern. Certain areas of campus will need pre-authorization for after-hours access.

The University takes proactive measures to ensure the security while maintaining campus facilities, including but not limited to, monthly fire safety checks (Adrian campus), monthly checks of emergency lighting (Adrian campus), monthly checks of egress lighting (Adrian campus). Each of the Siena Heights University campuses encourages all community members to report any unsafe facility concerns to maintenance or public safety.

Building hours vary depending upon scheduled events, typically 5 a.m.-10 p.m. if Public Safety opens the building.

Public Safety monitors and records many surveillance cameras, both inside common areas and parking lots. The residence halls are locked every night with restricted access via front doors. Maintenance, Public Safety, Emergency Response, and Custodial staff

all have lawful access to all University facilities. Residence Life Staff has lawful access to residence hall rooms to perform their safety duties.

FACILITY ACCESS (Degree Completion Center (Separate campus))

Each campus has individual building hours. Specific details and times can be obtained from each center's safety and/or security officers (see Emergency Services section of this publication).

MISSING STUDENT NOTIFICATION POLICY

For students residing in residential student housing on the Adrian Campus of Siena Heights University there is a confidential missing person notification program. To establish a confidential contact person complete the "Confidential Missing Person Contact" form located in the back of the Safety Handbook and submit to Public Safety for registration in the program.

Guidelines for missing students who live in University owned student residential housing:

- All missing student reports will be shared with local law enforcement agencies within 24 hours of Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety knowledge.
- For students under the age of 18 years, who are not emancipated, a custodial parent or guardian will be notified within 24 hours if the student is determined to be missing.
- Every effort will be made to contact the identified missing person contact if a
 form is properly registered with Public Safety should the student be determined
 to be missing.
- Information completed on the "Confidential Missing Person Contact" form
 will be registered and maintained by Public Safety and will be shared with Law
 Enforcement only for investigative purposes.

Should a resident student become missing it is required to:

 Contact Siena Heights University Public Safety Department immediately (may not exceed 24 hours) at 517.264.7800 (available 24/7/365). Or the Director of Public Safety at 517.264.7723 (business hours).

Siena Heights University department of Public Safety will work with local law enforcement to investigate all reports of missing residential housed students.

If a student wishes to update or change their form anytime during the academic year they may do so by contacting the Chief of Public Safety at 517-264-7723.

SIENA HEIGHTS UNIVERSITY PARKING RULES AND REGULATIONS

General Provisions

- The Department of Public Safety is responsible for the enforcement of the Siena Heights University parking rules and regulations.
- Siena Heights University may exclude or remove from the campus any
 vehicle that is: used as an instrument in a crime, mechanically unfit, a threat
 to the safety of the public, being operated by a person under the influence of
 intoxicants or drugs, suspected of being stolen or abandoned, has no authorized
 permit properly displayed, is persistently in violation of University parking and/
 or traffic regulations, or is deemed necessary by Siena Heights University Public
 Safety in order to maintain the law and order on the campus.
- For vehicles removed at the discretion of Siena Heights University Public Safety, the owner will be responsible for any charges associated with the removal and retrieval. The University is not liable for any damages that may occur while vehicles are towed or removed from campus.
- Redemption of revoked parking privileges is subject to a review by the Director of Public Safety, or designee, prior to reissuance.
- Nonpayment of parking violation fees will result in additional violations and fees assessed, up to loss of parking privileges and/or removal of vehicle.
- Siena Heights University parking rules and regulations are subject to change without notification at the discretion of the University.
- The City of Adrian is responsible for city street parking around the Siena Heights University Adrian campus. There is no overnight parking on certain city streets and is subject to the City of Adrian enforcement.

Parking Guidelines

Parking on the Siena Heights University Adrian campus is a privilege, not a
right, and is available to persons driving, and parking on campus solely under
the rules and regulation of the University Parking Policies.

- Students, faculty and staff members are expected to be familiar with and abide by
 University parking and traffic regulations. It is also the responsibility of the campus
 member to inform their guests and visitors of the rules and regulations.
- Students, faculty and staff members who park vehicles on the Adrian campus must properly display the appropriate approved parking permit.
- Violators of the parking regulations are subject to warnings, penalties and appropriate disciplinary and/or administrative action. Violatiors may be subject to fines, tows and related charges, wheel locks and/or loss of parking privileges.
- Siena Heights University assumes no responsibility for the care and/or protection
 of any vehicle, or its contents at any time it is operated or parked on campus. The
 University does not have any liability for damage or theft that may occur while
 parked on University property.
- The Department of Public Safety reserves the right to waive certain parking rules and regulations for specific events or emergencies on campus.
- Parking is on a first come basis, the University does not guarantee parking availability.

Parking Permits

Parking permit applications are available online at www.sienaheights.edu/parking, or at the Welcome Center located in the lobby of Ledwidge Hall.

Permit types: The color of the parking permit designates which type of parking permit it is. The letters on the permit indicate which parking lots are allowed for that permit type.

Student:


- Resident Hall (Green): 24 hour parking in the south fieldhouse parking lot and South side of the west field house parking lot Lot D
- Commuter (Red): Parking in the west field house parking lot, nursing lot, and the stadium parking lot Lots A, C, and G
- Campus Village Apartment Complex (Blue): 24 hour parking in the campus village apartment parking lot or the elm street overflow parking lot Lots E and F

Faculty/Staff (Yellow):

• Daytime parking only in the east field house parking lot and the stadium parking lot - Lots B and G

Visitor (Mirror Hang Tag):

• Short term parking in the east field house parking lot and the stadium parking lot - Lots B and G



Parking Permit Fees:

Students: (residents, commuters, campus village apt.)

- Permits are included in student fees
- per year: Aug 1 to July 31
- Replacement permits for all student permit types are free. (Avaible at the Welcome Center)
- Commuter students may petition to register more than one vehicle via email at parking@sienaheights.edu availability is determined on a case-by-case basis.
- Temporary Permits for rentals/short term vehicles available upon request at the Welcome Center.

Faculty/Staff:

- Permits are free.
- Replacement permits for faculty/staff are free.
 (Available at the Welcome Center)
- Graduate Assistants are eligible for faculty/staff parking.
- To register more than two vehicles petition via email at parking@ sienaheights.edu availability is determined on a case-by-case basis.
- Temporary permits for rentals/short term vehicles available upon request at the Public Safety Office.

Visitor/Guest: Free

- Short term parking for visitors and guests is available in the east field house parking lot and the stadium parking lot (no overnight) Lots B and G
- Extended parking (more than one business day) free permits are available online at www.sienaheights.edu/parking, or at the Welcome Center located in the lobby of Ledwidge Hall (must know plate information to register).
- Overnight parking for resident hall guests is available in the back field house parking lot – obtain parking permit when checking in as a residence hall guest at the Welcome Center located in the lobby of Ledwidge Hall -Lot D
- Campus Village Apartment and St. Catherine Complex has dedicated parking spaces for Apartment resident guests Lots E and F

- Overnight parking for University sponsored travel is located in the south field house parking lot; notification to Siena Heights University Department of Public Safety is required - Lot D
- Admissions guests: Free parking is located in the nursing parking lot off of Siena Heights Drive - Lot A
- **Dual enrolled High School students** may register one vehicle for extended parking (no overnight).

Parking Violations:

- Fouth violation may/will result in the towing of the vehicle.
- Failure to register/display approved permit \$35
 - All faculty, staff, and students must display approved permit
 - Display of unauthorized, counterfeit or fraudulent permits/temporary passes/citations.
 - Permits are not to be transferred from vehicle to vehicle
 - Permits are not to be duplicated
 - Use of permit past expiration date is prohibited
 - Altering or defacing of permit is prohibited
 - Providing False information on permit application
 - Placing permit where not readily visible
 - Failure to clear of snow or ice within a reasonable amount of time which obstructs the clear visibility of permit
- Parking in a prohibited area \$25
 - Adrian Dominican parking lots
 - Overnight parking in undesignated areas
 - Vehicles parking in posted motorcycle only parking
 - Motorcycles parking anywhere other than motorcycle parking
 - Parking in "service vehicle only parking" without proper designation
- Improper permit \$25
 - Parking in a parking lot not designated for displayed permit
- Handicapped space \$75
 - Parking in a marked handicap space without a proper state issued handicap placard or plate

• Visitor/guest space - \$25

 Faculty/staff and students are not to park in guest, visitor or admissions parking spaces

• No parking/tow away zone - \$40

- Fire lane, Sidewalks, Driveways/service drives, Loading zone,
 Blocking dumpsters, Reserved areas, Unlined areas, Trinity gardens,
- Grassy areas, Areas not designated for parking
- Athletic field or surrounding area

• Improper parking in lined areas - \$25

- Double parking
- Wheels of vehicle crossing over the yellow lines which define the parking space – it is the responsibility of the driver to know where the yellow lines are located even if visibility is impaired
- Vehicle is impaired or not mechanically fit, is not properly plated/ registered, or is illegal to operate in the State of Michigan

Mechanical problems: Vehicles parked illegally or overnight due to mechanical problems must be reported to Public Safety (517)264-7800.

Parking Violation Payments:

- Prices vary by violation type
- Parking fines will be added to student account, and must be paid through SHU student account.
- **Fourth violation** = tow at owners risk and expense.

Parking violation appeals:

• If a student wishes to appeal a parking citation they can bring the citation to the Welcome Center and speak with the Chief or Deputy of Public Safety.

TIPS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The Department of Public Safety welcomes you to Siena Heights University. The professional Public Safety staff is available 24 hours a day at the Ledwidge Hall Welcome Center or by phone at 517.264.7799 or "0" from a house phone. Our Public Safety Officers are trained in many aspects of crime prevention and community service. Below are a few important highlights for International Students. Additional safety tips are located in the remaining portions of this Campus Safety Awareness Handbook.

The International Student and the Law

As an international student, you are subject to US laws except those pertaining to immigration, voting rights and citizenship. You are also protected by US laws. Should you come into conflict with the law, the first people to contact are the International Student Advisors. They will let you know whom to contact next – either a lawyer or another responsible adult.

If an international student is accused of a violation of the law, international students (just like US citizens) may not be forced to confess or to give evidence against themselves; they may remain silent and refuse to answer any questions regarding the accusation against them, if they so choose. International students are entitled to have a lawyer to defend them in court, and if they cannot afford to hire a lawyer, they may have one appointed by the court. So, if an international student is arrested for any reason, they do not have to make any statements or answer any questions without legal counsel, i.e. a lawyer.

International students often worry that they will be deported should they come into conflict with the law. In general, they will not be deported for a single misdemeanor or a minor offense, e.g., larceny, disturbing the peace, etc. But if an international student is convicted of a crime involving "moral turpitude" for which they are then sentenced to one year or more in confinement, deportation is a real possibility. Charges relating to drug (narcotic drugs or marijuana) addiction, possession and sale fall into this category. Students who violate immigration laws and work illegally in the US may also be subject to deportation.

In addition to violation of the law, international students must consider several other related factors that may affect their immigration status.

TIPS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS CONT.

If an international student violates the rules of Siena Heights University and are disciplined by suspension or dismissal from the University, they will not have maintained legal status under the immigration laws, and can be deported for that reason. Students cannot be deported for violating a University regulation, but they can be deported for not being students in legal status. Also, sponsored students must keep in mind the regulations of the sponsoring agency. If those regulations are violated, the agency may withdraw financial and/or visa sponsorship. Finally, a student should consider the attitude of his/her home government toward any of his/her actions here, for the home/government is able to withdraw or cancel one's passport.

While many internationals may expect the US to be the "land of the free", it is often not long after arrival that sojourners realize this is a country of many rules and regulations. As you will see from the following description of some of the laws that may affect you, the rules and regulations are intended to protect the rights of the individual the basis for our legal system.

U.S. Criminal Sexual Conduct Code

It is important to have an understanding of US law in the Criminal Sexual Conduct Code. Individuals have the right to stop sexual contact at any time. Violation of the Criminal Sexual Conduct Code ranges from forced rape to improperly (without consent) touching the clothed or unclothed intimate body parts of another person. Violation of these laws can result in a prison or jail term of one to forty years and/or a fine from \$3,000 to \$40,000. If you become a sexual assault victim, contact the Department of Public Safety.

Tobacco Products

Use of tobacco products on Siena Heights University property is prohibited. For most businesses in the Lenawee County area smoking is prohibited inside. If you want to smoke, first look for "no smoking" signs or ask an employee to find out if smoking is permitted. Cigarettes and other tobacco products may not be purchased or used by persons under the age of 21.

TIPS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS CONT.

Alcohol use in the United States is also regulated by law. In Michigan, alcohol may not be legally purchased or consumed by anyone under the age of 21, and it may not be consumed while in an automobile. Driving while intoxicated is considered a serious crime, punishable by large fines, jail sentences, and the loss of driving privileges. Bartenders and others who serve alcohol (such as hosts of parties) can be held legally responsible if a guest becomes intoxicated and injures another person. It is also a serious crime to offer or provide alcohol to anyone under the age of 21.

Bystander Intervention



Bystander intervention is the act of feeling empowered and equipped with the knowledge and skills to effectively assist in the prevention of sexual violence and other crimes. A bystander is anyone who observes an emergency or a situation that looks like someone could use some help. Bystander Intervention programs teach people how to safely overcome their natural resistance to intervene and how to "step up". Siena Heights University offers a variety of bystander intervention programs throughout the academic year including Welcome Week.
